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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA, 1944

Manufacturing production in British Columbia declined during 1944. Compared with the previous year there were decreases of 6.0 per cent in the number of persons employed, 3.8 per cent in the salaries and wages paid and 1.3 per cent in the net value of production. The gross value of production was, however, \$3,798,376 or 0.6 per cent higher. The output of the iron and its products group which includes shipbuilding, declined by \$36,436,354 while non-ferrous metal products declined by \$10,702,703. The remaining groups of industry expanded their operations to the extent of \$50,937,433, as follows: wood and paper products \$21,387,545, vegetable products \$18,497,081, animal products \$6,437,540, non-metallic mineral products \$2,082,481, miscellaneous industries \$1,503,698, textiles \$726,815 and chemicals \$302,273.

In 1944 reports were received from 2,116 establishments in British Columbia. The combined output of these establishments was valued at \$655,844,689. Employment was furnished to 96,062 persons who were paid \$178,639,118 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used amounted to \$303,560,016, while the value added by manufacture totalled \$337,137,197.

Table 4 compares the principal statistics of the major industrial groups for the years 1943 and 1944. Normally, from the point of view of gross value of production, the wood and paper products group ranks first by a wide margin. In 1944 the dominant position was again taken by the iron and its products group with an output valued at \$218,091,597. Wood and paper came second with \$180,264,855, followed by vegetable products with \$77,160,941, animal products \$77,122,864, non-ferrous metal products \$34,066,668, chemicals and allied products \$28,620,166, non-metallic mineral products \$24,560,922, etc.

British Columbia was in 1944 again the third most important manufacturing province in the Dominion, with a gross value of production of \$655,844,689. About 19 per cent of this amount, viz., \$124,175,065, was contributed by the shipbuilding industry which advanced from sixth place in 1940 when the output was valued at only \$9,943,941. This industry also furnished employment to 24,615 persons or 25.6 per cent of the total number engaged in manufacturing. The output of the industry declined during 1944, the gross value of production dropping by \$31,361,331 and the number of persons employed by 6,623. The sawmilling industry ranked second with a gross value of production of \$98,381,844. Fish curing and packing was in third place with products valued at \$33,058,628, followed by pulp and paper with \$32,726,647, slaughtering and meat packing \$24,587,190, petroleum products \$17,278,190, fruit and vegetable preparations \$16,280,853, machinery \$13,986,622, butter and cheese \$13,168,262, fertilizers \$12,995,510, etc. Statistics of the leading industries are given in Table 5, while the statistics of the individual industries are given in Table 7.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA, 1944

The principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages with three or more establishments are given in Table 7. Vancouver with a production of \$289,390,718 leads by a wide margin, accounting for about 44 per cent of the total for the Province. Other principal cities, with the value of production, are: New Westminster \$41,929,249, Victoria \$30,346,621, Prince Rupert \$10,099,310, Port Alberni \$7,687,942, etc. North Vancouver and Trail which are second and third, respectively, are also important manufacturing centres. Figures, however, cannot be published.

Principal statistics of the industries located in Vancouver are given in Table 8, while the statistics of capital invested, power equipment and fuel consumption are given in Tables 9 to 11.
