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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA, 1945

With the end of the war in 1945, manufacturing production in British Columbia, as well as throughout the rest of Canada, dropped sharply. The production of war equipment was immediately curtailed and in many instances entirely discontinued. Many factories began to convert from war to peacetime production, while the production of many lines of consumers goods surged upwards. As a result of these changes, production in British Columbia during 1945, which was valued at \$628,903,124, represented a drop of \$26,941,565 or 4.1 per cent as compared with the previous year. There was also a drop of 8,088 or 8.4 per cent in the number of persons employed and \$18,219,985 or 10.2 per cent in the amount of salaries and wages paid. As was to be expected, the iron and its products group reported the greatest decline in the value of production with a drop of \$76,396,123 followed by a drop of \$1,327,493 for the miscellaneous industries group and \$843,721 for non-metallic mineral products. On the other hand, the value of production of many lines of consumers goods advanced. The output of animal products was \$15,817,943 higher, followed by an increase of \$14,549,631 for wood and paper products, \$11,467,036 for vegetable products, \$7,367,793 for non-ferrous metal products, \$1,915,756 for chemicals, and \$507,613 for textiles and textile products.

In 1945 reports were received from 2,326 establishments in British Columbia with a combined output valued at \$628,903,124. Employment was furnished to 87,974 persons who were paid \$160,419,133 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used amounted to \$305,759,836, while the value added by manufacture totalled \$307,954,519.

The production of wood and paper products which in 1945 had a gross value of production of \$194,814,486, again headed the list of British Columbia manufacturing operations, having displaced the iron and its products group which occupied the premier position during the war years. The output of the iron and its products group which was valued at \$141,695,474 ranked second, followed by animal products with \$92,940,807, vegetable products \$88,627,977, non-ferrous metal products \$41,434,461, chemicals and allied products \$30,535,922, non-metallic mineral products \$23,717,201, textiles \$9,277,222, and miscellaneous industries \$5,859,574.

British Columbia with a gross value of production of \$628,903,124 in 1945 was again the third most important manufacturing province in the Dominion. About 17 per cent of this amount; viz., \$104,972,850 was contributed by the sawmilling industry. Shipbuilding with a value of production of \$82,125,280 was in second place. This industry which occupied first place during the war years was an important factor in British Columbia's manufacturing operations. At the height of its productive effort in 1943 it employed 31,238 persons who were paid \$64,939,484 in salaries and wages, while the value of production reached the unprecedented figure of \$155,536,396. In spite of its decline, the shipbuilding industry in 1945 was still the largest employer of labour and also paid out the highest amount in salaries and wages. Fish curing and packing with a value of production of \$43,837,973 was in third place, followed by pulp and paper with \$35,304,731, slaughtering and meat packing \$27,571,637, fruit and vegetable preparations \$16,430,054, petroleum products \$16,230,791, fertilizers \$15,901,652, etc.

The principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages with three or more establishments are given in Table 7. Vancouver with a production of \$265,034,773 leads by a wide margin, accounting for about 42 per cent of the total for the Province. Other principal cities with the value of production are: Trail, \$58,130,359; New Westminster, \$44,563,011; Victoria, \$26,389,895; Prince Rupert, \$9,788,217; Port Alberni, \$9,093,511, etc. North Vancouver is also an important manufacturing centre. Figures, however, cannot be published.

Principal statistics of the industries located in Vancouver are given in Table 8, while the statistics of capital invested, power equipment and fuel consumption are given in Tables 9 to 11.
