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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1935.

The gross value of manufactured products, which totalled \$1,423,562,474 in 1935 represents an increase of 13.4 per cent as compared with the previous year. Reports were received from 10,266 manufacturing establishments with a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$2,064,194,151. The number of persons employed totalled 281,438 and the salaries and wages paid \$303,807,207, while the cost of materials used and value added by manufacture were \$718,570,816 and \$668,918,734, respectively.

The turning point of the depression was reached in the summer of 1933. The increases in the latter part of the year were not, however, sufficiently pronounced to offset the losses of the beginning of the year. The result was that the principal statistics for 1933 were the lowest since 1929. Considerable improvement was reported in 1934 and 1935. Compared with the previous year, there was an increase in 1935 of 8.4 per cent in the number of employees, with an even greater increase in the amount paid out in salaries and wages, viz. 12.1 per cent. The increase in the value of production was 13.4 per cent, and in the value added by manufacture 9.4 per cent. In spite of the improvement during the previous two years, the number of employees in 1935 was still 17.2 per cent below the 1929 figures. The improvement in salaries and wages paid was even less favourable, the figures for 1935 being 28 per cent below the amount paid in 1929.

In analysing the improvement by major industrial groups, it is found that iron and steel products with an increase of 31 per cent in the gross value of production recorded the greatest gain. Central electric stations with an increase of 23 per cent were next in order, followed by non-ferrous metal industries 20 per cent, chemical products 13 per cent, animal products 10 per cent, miscellaneous industries 9 per cent, wood and paper 8 per cent, vegetable products 6 per cent, non-metallic mineral products 4 per cent and textile products 3.5 per cent.

Ontario is the most important manufacturing province in the Dominion. This favourable position is not of recent growth, but has been maintained over a long period of years. In spite of the rapid industrial development in recent years in other provinces, such as Quebec, British Columbia and Manitoba, Ontario is maintaining a manufacturing production equal to that of the remainder of the Dominion. Ontario also has the greatest diversification of manufacturing production of any province. Outstanding among the industries in which the Province of Ontario is pre-eminent is that of automobile manufacturing which is carried on practically in this Province alone. Other important industries in which Ontario leads with the percentage which the production of each bears to that of the Dominion total in 1935 are as follows: agricultural implements 96 per cent, leather tanneries 88 per cent, rubber goods, including footwear, 83 per cent, furniture 63 per cent, fruit and vegetable preparations 68 per cent, electrical apparatus and supplies 78 per cent, castings and forgings 68 per cent, primary iron and steel 65 per cent, flour and feed mills 53 per cent, and hosiery and knitted goods 65 per cent.

Table 3 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1934 and 1935. From the standpoint of gross value of production, the iron and steel products group headed the list with an output valued at \$282,791,632. Other

groups in order of their importance were: vegetable products \$254,613,031, non-ferrous metal products \$180,945,758, wood and paper products \$178,877,722, animal products \$153,353,564 and textile products \$151,728,944.

Table 4 reviews the principal statistics of the forty leading industries of Ontario in 1935. In value of production, automobiles head the list with an output valued at \$105,810,655. Other leading industries in the order of their importance are: non-ferrous metal smelting \$105,035,029, slaughtering and meat packing \$56,932,181, central electric stations \$53,535,095, flour mills \$51,760,071, pulp and paper mills \$51,041,765, electrical apparatus and supplies \$47,503,325, rubber goods, including footwear, \$46,466,350. Some changes took place in the ranking of some of the leading industries. Flour and feed mills dropped from fourth place in 1934 to fifth place in 1935, while automobiles, breweries and leather tanneries each advanced one step.

Table 5 reviews the principal statistics of the individual industries which make up the various groups shown in table 3.

Table 6 covers the principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages having three or more establishments. It will be observed that the City of Toronto with a production valued at \$385,883,455 accounted for 28.1 per cent of the entire output of the Province exclusive of central electric stations. Hamilton is next with a production of \$114,691,789 or 8.4 per cent. These two cities accounted for 36.5 per cent of the entire production of the Province in 1935.

Details of capital investment by industrial groups are shown in table 9 for 1935. Of the total capital of \$2,064,194,151, \$1,450,701,837 represents land, buildings, machinery and tools and is a decrease of \$6,498,707 from the corresponding figure for 1934. The decrease in fixed assets is in part due to charges for depreciation. Inventory value of finished products, raw materials, stocks in process, fuel and miscellaneous supplies on hand amounted to \$310,242,172. The corresponding figures for these items in 1934 were \$300,568,145. Cash, bills and accounts receivable, prepaid expenses, etc., totalled \$303,250,142 in 1935 as compared with \$305,952,686 the previous year.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumption are shown in tables 10 and 11.

The item "all other non-metallic mineral products" includes: - 2 abrasive products, 1 asbestos products, 2 cement products, 2 miscellaneous non-metallic mineral products and 2 petroleum products.

The item "all other chemicals and chemical products" includes: - 1 acids, alkalies and salts, 1 coal tar distillation, 1 fertilizers, 1 compressed gases, 1 medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations and 1 toilet preparations.

The item "all other miscellaneous products" includes: - 2 mattresses and springs, 2 scientific and professional equipment and 1 electric signs.
