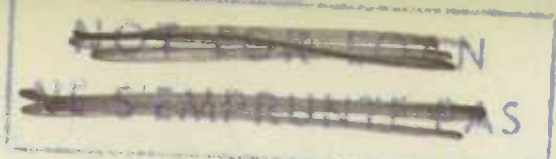

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1937

The gross value of manufactured products, which totalled \$1,878,088,188 in 1937 represents an increase of 21.4 per cent as compared with the previous year. Reports were received from 9,796 manufacturing establishments with a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$1,674,806,201. The number of persons employed totalled 321,743 and the salaries and wages paid \$373,018,048, while the cost of materials used and value added by manufacture were \$1,025,871,841 and \$802,403,114, respectively.

The upward climb in manufacturing production begun in the summer of 1933 was greatly accelerated in 1937. Compared with the previous year there was an increase of 21.4 per cent in the gross value of production, 16.9 per cent in the value added by manufacturing, 11.3 per cent in the number of persons employed and 18.5 per cent in the salaries and wages paid. In many respects 1937 was a record year. Although the number of persons employed was still about 2 per cent below the number employed in 1929 actually the number employed was somewhat higher. As explained in the footnote to Table 1, there was a change in method of compiling the average number of wage-earners between 1925 and 1930. This increased the number somewhat over that which the method now employed would have given. Salary and wage payments, although substantially higher than a number of years back, are still about 8 per cent below the 1929 level. The physical volume of production is, however, the highest on record. It is estimated that the volume in 1937 was about 7 per cent greater than in 1929. Due to a drop of 13.4 per cent in the prices of fully and chiefly manufactured products, however, the gross value of production is still some 7 per cent below the 1929 figures.

An analysis of the improvement by major industrial groups shows that non-ferrous metal products, with an increase of 37 per cent in the gross value of production, recorded the greatest gain in 1937. This was followed by iron and its products with a gain of 35 per cent, miscellaneous products, 18 per cent, chemical products 18 per cent, wood and paper products, 17 per cent, non-metallic mineral products, 16 per cent, animal products, 13 per cent, vegetable products, 12 per cent and textiles and textile products, 9 per cent.

Ontario is the most important manufacturing province in the Dominion. This favourable position is not of recent growth, but has been maintained over a long period of years. In spite of the rapid industrial development in recent years in other provinces, such as Quebec, British Columbia and Manitoba, Ontario is maintaining a manufacturing production equal to that of the remainder of the Dominion. Ontario also has the greatest diversification of manufacturing production of any province. Outstanding among the industries in which the Province of Ontario is pre-eminent is that of automobile manufacturing which is carried on practically in this Province alone. Other important industries in which Ontario leads with the percentage which the production of each bears to that of the Dominion total in 1937 are as follows: agricultural implements, 96 per cent, leather tanneries, 88 per cent, rubber goods, including footwear, 82 per cent, furniture, 59 per cent, fruit and vegetable preparations, 69 per cent, electrical apparatus and supplies, 75 per cent, castings and forgings, 67 per cent, primary iron and steel, 62 per cent, flour and feed mills, 53 per cent, and hosiery and knitted goods, 62 per cent.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1937

Table 3 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1936 and 1937. From the standpoint of gross value of production, the iron and its products group headed the list with an output valued at \$421,461,048. Other groups in order of their importance were: vegetable products \$344,631,410, non-ferrous metal products \$312,232,649, wood and paper products, \$232,428,161, animal products \$195,033,984, textiles and textile products \$166,805,398.

Table 4 reviews the principal statistics of the forty leading industries of Ontario in 1937. In gross value of production, non-ferrous metal smelting and refining again heads the list with an output valued at \$192,248,914. Other leading industries in the order of their importance are: automobiles \$133,315,645, slaughtering and meat packing \$75,917,387, electrical apparatus and supplies, \$74,510,006, pulp and paper \$72,948,378, flour mills, \$70,815,603, rubber goods \$61,040,569, butter and cheese \$54,744,598, etc. Salaries and wages paid the ranking of the industries is different. In this respect the automobile industry heads the list followed by electrical apparatus and supplies, pulp and paper, etc.

Table 5 reviews the principal statistics of the individual industries which make up the various groups shown in Table 3.

Table 6 covers the principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages having three or more establishments. It will be observed that the city of Toronto with a production valued at \$475,470,149 accounted for 25 per cent of the entire output of the province. Hamilton came second with a production of \$163,351,205 and Windsor third with \$136,896,194. These three cities accounted for 41.6 per cent of the total production of the Province in 1937.

Details of capital investment by industrial groups are shown in Table 10 for 1937. Of the total capital of \$1,674,806,201, \$977,861,703 represents land, buildings, machinery and tools and is an increase of \$18,845,283 over the corresponding figure for 1936. Inventory value of finished products, raw materials, stock in process, fuel and miscellaneous supplies on hand amounted to \$387,417,746. The corresponding figure for these items in 1936 was \$332,756,305. Cash, bills and accounts receivable, prepaid expenses, etc., totalled \$309,526,752 in 1937 as compared with \$296,711,405 the previous year.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumption are shown in Tables 11 and 12.
