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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1939.

The gross value of manufactured products which totalled \$1,745,674,707 in 1939 represents an increase of 1.9 per cent as compared with the previous year. Reports were received from 9,824 manufacturing establishments with a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$1,762,571,669. The number of persons employed totalled 318,871 and the salaries and wages paid \$378,376,209, while the cost of materials used and the value added by manufacture were \$907,011,461 and \$791,428,569 respectively.

The upward climb in manufacturing production begun in the summer of 1933 was greatly accelerated in 1937. Compared with the previous year there was an increase of 21.4 per cent in the gross value of production, 16.9 per cent in the value added by manufacturing, 11.3 per cent in the number of persons employed and 18.5 per cent in the salaries and wages paid. In many respects 1937 was a record year. Although the number of persons employed was still about 2 per cent below the number employed in 1929 actually the number employed was somewhat higher. As explained in the footnote to Table 1, there was a change in method of compiling the average number of wage-earners between 1925 and 1930. This increased the number somewhat over that which the method now employed would have given. Salary and wage payments, although substantially higher than a number of years back, were still about 8 per cent below the 1929 level. The physical volume of production was, however, the highest on record. It is estimated that the volume in 1937 was about 7 per cent greater than in 1929. However, due a drop of 13.4 per cent in the prices of fully and chiefly manufactured products, the gross value of production was still some 7 per cent below the 1929 figures.

This steady expansion was followed by a minor recession in 1938. Compared with the previous year there were decreases of 8.9 per cent in the gross value of production, 3.2 per cent in the number of employees, 4.4 per cent in the salaries and wages paid and 5.8 per cent in the value added by manufacture. Production again expanded in 1939 but not in sufficient volume to offset the losses of the previous year, with the result that the gross value of production and employment were still below the 1937 level. Salary and wage payments, however, were greater than in 1937 although the number of employees was not as high.

Ontario is the most important manufacturing province in the Dominion. This favourable position is not of recent growth, but has been maintained over a long period of years. In spite of the rapid industrial development in recent years in other provinces, such as Quebec, British Columbia and Manitoba, Ontario is maintaining a manufacturing production equal to that of the remainder of the Dominion. Ontario also has the greatest diversification of manufacturing production of any province. Outstanding among the industries in which the Province of Ontario is pre-eminent is that of agricultural implement and automobile manufacture which is carried on practically in this Province alone. Other important industries in which Ontario leads, with the percentage which the production of each bears to that of the Dominion total in 1939, are as follows: leather tanneries 88 per cent, rubber goods, including footwear 80 per cent, electrical apparatus and supplies 76 per cent, fruit and vegetable preparations 67 per cent, castings and forgings 64 per cent, primary iron and steel 64 per cent, hosiery and knitted goods 59 per cent, flour and feed mills 57 per cent, and furniture 56 per cent.

Table 4 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1938 and 1939. From the standpoint of gross value of production, the iron and its products group headed the list with an output valued at \$374,004,529. Other groups in order of their importance were: vegetable products \$335,483,227, non-ferrous metal products \$248,229,760, wood and paper products \$224,593,530, animal products \$199,245,740, textiles and textile products \$158,701,791.

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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1939.

Table 5 reviews the principal statistics of the forty leading industries of Ontario in 1939. In gross value of production, non-ferrous metal smelting and refining again heads the list with an output valued at \$134,726,912. Other leading industries in order of their importance are: automobiles \$102,102,931, slaughtering and meat packing \$79,480,472, electrical apparatus and supplies \$67,733,158, pulp and paper \$65,486,349, flour and feed mills \$58,336,183, rubber goods \$55,784,921, butter and cheese \$52,663,274, primary iron and steel \$48,925,939, automobile supplies \$37,975,560, etc. In salaries and wages paid the ranking of the industries are different. In this respect the automobile industry heads the list, followed by electrical apparatus and supplies, pulp and paper, primary iron and steel, etc.

Table 6 reviews the principal statistics of the individual industries which make up the various groups shown in Table 4.

Table 7 covers the principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages having three or more establishments. It will be observed that the city of Toronto with a production valued at \$482,532,331 accounted for 27.6 per cent of the entire output of the province. Hamilton came second with a production of \$152,746,340 and Windsor third with \$122,474,320. These three cities accounted for 43.4 per cent of the total production of the Province in 1939.

Details of capital investment by industrial groups are shown in Table 11 for 1939. Of the total capital of \$1,762,571,669, \$997,402,824 represents land, buildings, machinery and tools and is an increase of \$6,314,183 over the corresponding figure for 1938. Inventory value of finished products, raw materials, stock in process, fuel and miscellaneous supplies on hand amounted to \$395,179,051. The corresponding figure for these items in 1938 was \$368,983,921. Cash, bills and accounts receivable, prepaid expenses, etc., totalled \$369,989,794 in 1939 as compared with \$316,823,613 the previous year.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumption are shown in Tables 12 and 13.

The item "all other vegetable products" includes 1 flour and feed mill, 1 ice cream cones, 1 macaroni, vermicelli, etc., 2 tobacco, cigars and cigarettes.

The item "all other animal products" includes 1 leather tannery, 2 belting, leather, 1 boots and shoes, leather and 1 dairy products, others.

The item "all other textile products" includes 1 cotton thread, 1 woollen yarn, 2 carpets, mats and rugs, 2 woollen goods, n.e.s., 1 dyeing and finishing of textiles, 2 clothing, women's factory, 1 cordage, rope and twine and 2 bags, cotton and jute.

The item "all other wood and paper products" includes 1 roofing paper, wallboard, etc., 2 printing and publishing, 2 lithographing, 1 blueprinting, 2 trade composition, 2 carriages, wagons and sleighs, 2 cooperage, 1 boxes, wooden, 2 boatbuilding and 2 coffins and caskets.

The item "all other iron and steel products" includes 1 agricultural implements, 2 automobile supplies, 2 aircraft and 1 bridge and structural steel work.

The item "all other non-ferrous metal products" includes 2 aluminium products, 1 white metal alloys and 2 miscellaneous non-ferrous metal products.

The item "all other non-metallic mineral products" includes 2 asbestos products, 2 abrasive products, 1 petroleum products.

The item "all other chemical products" includes 1 coal tar distillation, 1 acids, alkalies and salts, 1 gases, compressed, 1 fertilizers, 2 paints, pigments and varnishes and 1 toilet preparations.

The item "all other miscellaneous industries" includes 1 mattresses and springs, 2 ice, manufactured, 2 scientific and professional equipment, 1 signs, electric, neon and other, and 1 estuary and art goods.
