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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1940.

To meet the demands created by the present war, the output of the manufacturing industries of Ontario was greatly accelerated during 1940. Compared with the previous year there were increases of 16.9 per cent in the number of persons employed, 26.7 per cent in the salaries and wages paid and 31.9 per cent in the gross value of production. Of the increase in the gross value of production amounting to \$556,339,947, 45 per cent was contributed by the iron and its products group, 14 per cent by the non-ferrous metal industries, 13 per cent by the textile industries, 9 per cent by wood and paper products and the balance by the other groups in the order named: vegetable products, animal products, non-metallic mineral products, chemicals and allied products and miscellaneous industries.

In 1940 reports were received from 10,040 establishments operating in Ontario. Their combined output was valued at \$2,302,014,654. Employment was furnished to 372,643 persons who were paid \$479,399,188 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used was valued at \$1,236,738,529, while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$1,004,529,583. The investment in fixed and current assets totalled \$1,988,461,940.

Ontario is the most important manufacturing province in the Dominion. This favourable position is not of recent growth, but has been maintained over a long period of years. In spite of the rapid industrial development in recent years in other provinces, such as Quebec, British Columbia and Manitoba, Ontario is maintaining a manufacturing production equal to that of the remainder of the Dominion. Ontario also has the greatest diversification of manufacturing production of any province. Outstanding among the industries in which the Province of Ontario is pre-eminent is that of starch, agricultural implements and automobile manufacture which is carried on practically in this Province alone. Other important industries in which Ontario leads, with the percentage which the production of each bears to that of the Dominion total in 1940, are as follows: leather tanneries 87.7 per cent, rubber goods 80.8 per cent, electrical apparatus and supplies 78.2 per cent, primary iron and steel 66.6 per cent, fruit and vegetable preparations 63.6 per cent, iron castings 62.8 per cent, hosiery and knitted goods 58.7 per cent, flour and feed mills 57.3 per cent, and furniture 56.1 per cent.

Table 4 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1939 and 1940. From the standpoint of gross value of production, the iron and its products group again headed the list with an output valued at \$623,197,243. Other groups in order of their importance were: vegetable products \$368,511,386, non-ferrous metal products \$324,322,963, wood and paper products \$275,583,548, textiles and textile products \$233,497,596, animal products \$227,794,394, etc.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1940.

Table 5 reviews the principal statistics of the forty leading industries of Ontario in 1940. In gross value of production, the automobile industry with an output valued at \$182,434,910 headed the list, displacing the non-ferrous metal smelting and refining industry with a value of production of \$150,476,156, which came second this year. Other leading industries in order of their importance are: electrical apparatus and supplies \$101,671,361, slaughtering and meat packing \$91,861,374, pulp and paper \$87,966,119, primary iron and steel \$76,335,959, flour and feed mills \$70,145,829, rubber goods \$67,051,598, automobile supplies \$63,935,495, machinery \$59,101,512, butter and cheese \$58,489,215, etc. In salaries and wages paid the ranking of the industries is different. In this respect the automobile industry heads the list, followed by electrical apparatus and supplies, primary iron and steel, pulp and paper, etc.

Table 6 reviews the principal statistics of the individual industries making up the various groups shown in Table 4.

Table 7 covers the principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages having three or more establishments. It will be observed that the city of Toronto with a production valued at \$595,913,172 accounted for 25.9 per cent of the entire output of the province. Hamilton came second with a production of \$212,587,274, and Windsor third with \$194,174,159. These three cities accounted for 43.6 per cent of the total production of the Province in 1940.

Statistics of capital investment, power equipment and fuel consumption are given in Tables 11 to 13.
