

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1941.

Under the impetus of war production, the manufacturing industries of Ontario greatly accelerated their output of manufactured products in 1941. Compared with the previous year there were increases of 25.7 per cent in the number of persons employed, 37.8 per cent in the salaries and wages paid, and 35.6 per cent in the gross value of production. Of the increase in the gross value of production amounting to \$819,741,914, 47 per cent was contributed by the iron and its products group, 12 per cent by the vegetable products industries, 12 per cent by non-ferrous metal industries, and the balance by the other groups in the order named: wood and paper products, animal products, chemicals and allied products, non-metallic mineral products, textiles and textile products, and miscellaneous industries.

In 1941, reports were received from 10,250 establishments operating in Ontario. Their combined output was valued at \$3,121,756,568. Employment was furnished to 468,230 persons who were paid \$660,722,278 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used was valued at \$1,683,912,216, while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$1,360,055,756. The investment in fixed and current assets totalled \$2,336,788,884.

Ontario is the most important manufacturing province in the Dominion. This favourable position is not of recent growth, but has been maintained over a long period of years. In spite of the rapid industrial development in recent years in other provinces, such as Quebec, British Columbia and Manitoba, Ontario is maintaining a manufacturing production equal to that of the remainder of the Dominion. Ontario also has the greatest diversification of manufacturing production of any province. Outstanding among the industries in which the Province of Ontario is pre-eminent is that of starch, agricultural implements and automobile manufacture which is carried on practically in this Province alone. Other important industries in which Ontario leads, with the percentage which the production of each bears to that of the Dominion total in 1941, are as follows: leather tanneries 87.9, rubber goods 81.8, electrical apparatus and supplies 76.1, primary iron and steel 68.7, iron castings 68.0, fruit and vegetable preparations 66.0, flour and feed mills 60.7, hosiery and knitted goods 57.8, and furniture 56.5.

Table 4 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1940 and 1941. From the standpoint of the gross value of production, the iron and its products group again headed the list with an output valued at \$1,012,490,163. Other groups in order of importance were: vegetable products \$463,261,689, non-ferrous metal products \$418,392,444, wood and paper products \$334,248,664, animal products \$284,462,887, textiles and textile products \$262,018,982, etc.

Table 5 reviews the principal statistics of the forty leading industries of Ontario in 1941. In gross value of production, the automobile industry with an output valued at \$275,129,363 again headed the list. Non-ferrous metal smelting and refining with a value of production of \$171,099,809 ranked second. Other leading industries in order of their importance are: electrical apparatus and supplies \$135,383,812, automobile supplies \$122,870,244, slaughtering and meat packing \$116,414,929, primary iron and steel \$113,108,878, pulp and paper \$100,-925,759, etc. In salaries and wages paid the ranking of the industries is different.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1941.

In this respect the automobile industry also heads the list, followed by electrical apparatus and supplies, primary iron and steel, automobile supplies, machinery, etc.

Table 6 reviews the principal statistics of the individual industries making up the various groups shown in Table 4.

Table 7 covers the principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages having three or more establishments. The city of Toronto with a production of \$756,923,939 accounted for 24.3 per cent of the entire output of the province. Windsor came second with a production of \$289,027,790, and Hamilton third with \$283,670,019. These three cities accounted for 42.6 per cent of the provincial production in 1941. A significant change in 1941 was the displacement of Hamilton from second place by Windsor.

Statistics of capital investment, power equipment and fuel consumption are given in Tables 11 to 13.


