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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1944

Under the continued impetus of war production the manufacturing industries of the Province of Ontario operated at a high level of production during 1944, although at a slightly reduced scale. Compared with the previous year there was a decrease of 5,625 or 1.0 per cent in the number of persons employed, while the salaries and wages paid and the gross value of production were both up by 1.9 and 2.8 per cent, respectively. The iron and its products group reported the greatest decline in production, as measured by the number of persons employed, with a drop of 10,370 persons. Employment in the chemicals and allied products group declined by 3,540, textiles and textile products, 1,885, and non-ferrous metal products 1,268. The vegetable, wood and paper, animal and non-metallic mineral products groups, on the other hand, were more active as is indicated by the increases in employment of 8,601, 1,316, 930 and 536, respectively. There was only a slight change in employment in the miscellaneous industries group.

In 1944, reports were received from 10,759 establishments operating in Ontario. Their combined output was valued at \$4,339,797,784. Employment was furnished to 564,392 persons who were paid \$975,038,060 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used was valued at \$2,310,347,858, while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$1,930,043,913.

Ontario is the most important manufacturing province in the Dominion. This favourable position is not of recent growth, but has been maintained over a long period of years. In spite of the rapid industrial development in recent years in other provinces, such as Quebec, British Columbia and Manitoba, Ontario is maintaining a manufacturing production equal to that of the remainder of the Dominion. In 1942 the percentage was 50.5, due to the relatively greater expansion in war production in other provinces. The percentage dropped to 47.8 in 1944.

Ontario has also the greatest diversification of manufacturing production of any province. Outstanding among the industries in which this Province is pre-eminent are those of automobiles, agricultural implements and starch manufacture which are carried on practically in this province alone. Other important industries in which Ontario leads, with the percentage which the production of each bears to that of the Dominion total in 1944 are as follows: leather tanneries 86.3, rubber goods 85.3, primary iron and steel 69.9, electrical apparatus and supplies 63.7, iron castings 61.7, fruit and vegetable preparations 59.5, flour and feed mills 57.7, furniture 56.5 and hosiery and knitted goods 54.6.

Table 4 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1943 and 1944. From the standpoint of gross value of production, the iron and its products group again headed the list with an output valued at \$1,489,172,929. Other groups in order of their importance were: vegetable products \$651,705,186, non-ferrous metal products \$526,157,444, wood and paper products \$590,418,343, animal products \$370,389,478, chemicals and allied products \$304,317,467, textiles and textile products \$293,593,419, non-metallic mineral products \$199,293,850, and miscellaneous industries \$114,749,668.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1944

Table 5 reviews the principal statistics of the forty leading industries of Ontario in 1944. In gross value of production, the automobile industry with an output valued at \$323,287,967 again headed the list. Aircraft with a value of production of \$217,573,199 ranked second. Other leading industries in the order of their importance are: electrical apparatus and supplies \$180,226,910, non-ferrous metal smelting and refining \$179,256,596, slaughtering and meat packing \$158,666,667, automobile supplies \$155,533,947, primary iron and steel \$148,598,186, etc. In salaries and wages paid the ranking of the industries is different. In this respect the aircraft industry heads the list, followed by automobiles, electrical apparatus and supplies, miscellaneous iron and steel products, automobile supplies, etc.

Table 6 reviews the principal statistics of the individual industries making up the various groups shown in Table 4.

Table 7 covers the principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages having three or more establishments. The city of Toronto with a production of \$1,020,345,353 accounted for 25.5 per cent of the entire output of the province. Windsor came second with a production of \$387,603,874, and Hamilton third with \$363,033,672. These three cities accounted for 40.8 per cent of the provincial production in 1944. Hamilton before the war ranked second while Windsor ranked third.

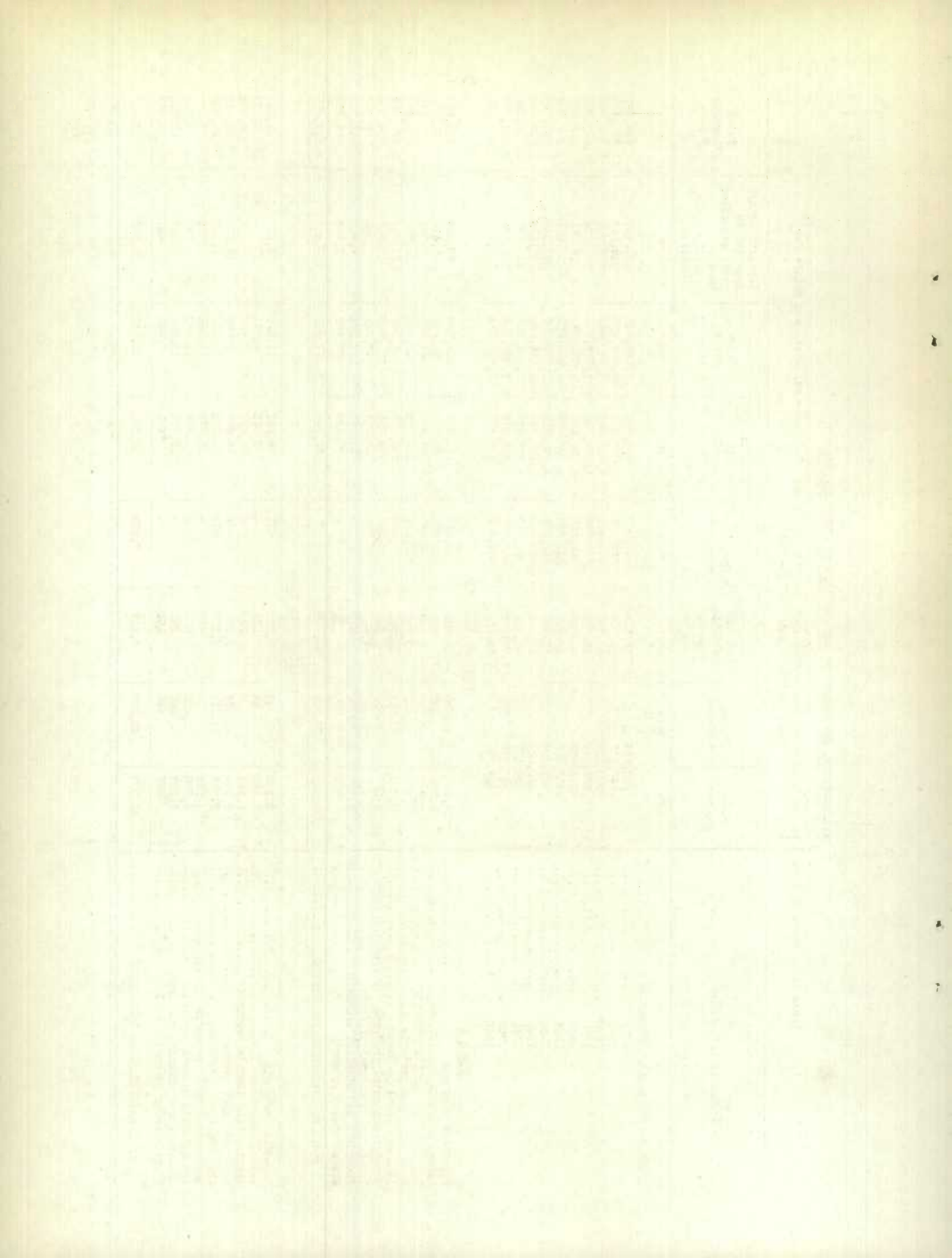
