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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, 1945

With the end of the war in 1945, manufacturing production in Ontario, as well as throughout the rest of Canada, dropped sharply. The production of war equipment was immediately curtailed and in many instances entirely discontinued. Many factories began to convert from war to peace-time production, while the production of many lines of consumers goods surged upward. As a result of these changes, production in Ontario during 1945 which was valued at \$3,965,069,021 represented a drop of \$374,728,763 or 8.6 per cent as compared with the previous year. There was also a drop of 46,336 or 8.2 per cent in the number of persons employed and \$92,554,673 or 9.5 per cent in the amount of salaries and wages paid. As was to be expected, the iron and its products group reported the greatest decline in production, with a drop of 45,904 persons. Employment in the non-ferrous metal products group also declined by 5,406, chemicals and allied products by 3,321, and the miscellaneous industries group by 1,330. On the other hand, employment in industries producing consumers goods advanced. There was thus an increase of 4,059 persons in the wood and paper products group, 2,315 in vegetable products, 1,621 in animal products, 1,479 in textiles and 151 in non-metallic mineral products.

In 1945, reports were received from 10,869 establishments operating in Ontario. Their combined output was valued at \$3,965,069,021. Employment was furnished to 518,056 persons who were paid \$882,483,387 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used was valued at \$2,148,290,603, while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$1,720,938,199.

Ontario is the most important manufacturing province in the Dominion. This favourable position is not of recent growth, but has been maintained over a long period of years. In spite of the rapid industrial development in recent years in other provinces, such as Quebec, British Columbia and Manitoba, Ontario is maintaining a manufacturing production equal to that of the remainder of the Dominion. In 1939 this percentage equalled 50.2. Due to the relatively greater expansion in war production in other provinces during the war years the percentage declined to 47.8 in 1944 and rose slightly to 48.1 in 1945.

Ontario also has the greatest diversification of manufacturing production of any province. Outstanding among the industries in which this province is pre-eminent are those of automobiles, agricultural implements and starch manufacture which are carried on practically in this province alone. Other important industries in which Ontario leads, with the percentage which the production of each bears to that of the Dominion total in 1945 are as follows: leather tanneries 85.6, rubber goods 84.9, electrical apparatus and supplies 71.2, primary iron and steel 67.5, iron castings 61.0, fruit and vegetable preparations 56.7, flour and feed mills 55.8, hosiery and knitted goods 54.0, and furniture 52.8.

Table 4 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1944 and 1945. From the standpoint of gross value of production, the iron and its products group again headed the list with an output valued at \$1,185,566,783. Other groups in order of their importance were: vegetable products \$685,590,383, non-

ferrous metal products \$456,734,685, wood and paper products \$422,071,993, animal products \$380,202,219, textiles and textile products \$299,520,873, chemicals and allied products \$230,267,807, non-metallic mineral products \$193,064,892, and miscellaneous industries \$112,049,386.

Table 5 reviews the principal statistics of the forty leading industries of Ontario in 1945. In gross value of production, the automobile industry with an output valued at \$227,952,315 again headed the list. Aircraft with a value of production of \$184,740,970 ranked second. Other leading industries in the order of their importance are: electrical apparatus and supplies \$164,152,400, non-ferrous metal smelting and refining \$162,606,005, rubber goods \$153,979,169, slaughtering and meat packing \$153,058,002, primary iron and steel \$129,796,623, etc. In salaries and wages paid the ranking of the industries is different. In this respect the electrical apparatus and supplies industry headed the list, followed by automobiles, aircraft, primary iron and steel, automobile supplies, rubber goods, etc.

Table 6 reviews the principal statistics of the individual industries making up the various groups shown in Table 4.

Table 7 covers the principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages for which information may be published. The city of Toronto with a production of \$961,736,716 accounted for 24.3 per cent of the entire output of the province. Hamilton came second with a production of \$351,676,308, and Windsor third with \$280,743,622. These three cities accounted for 40.2 per cent of the provincial production in 1945. During the war years Windsor ranked second in production.
