Other tables of the report dealing with the principal phases of industrial activity appear in the following order:

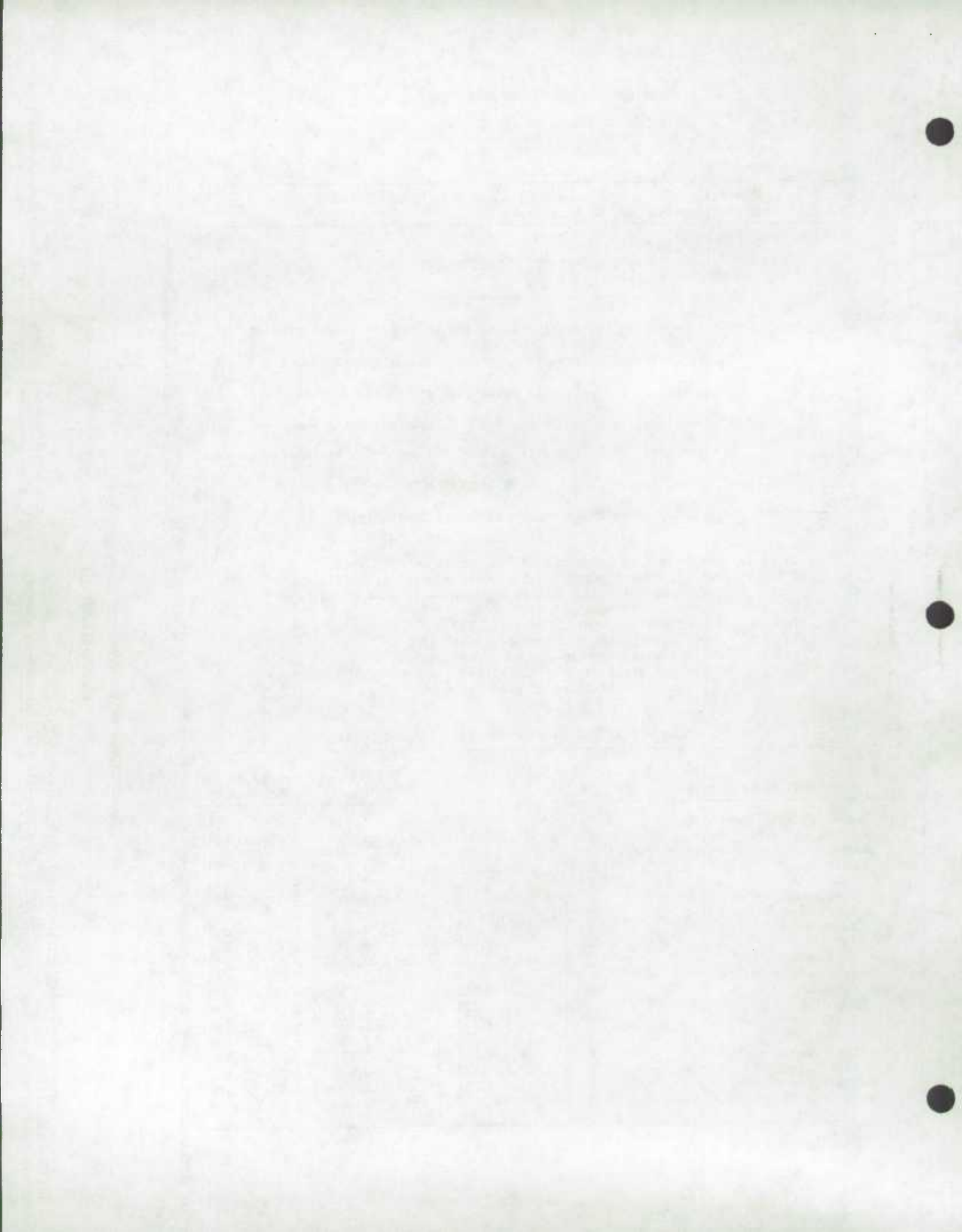

FORTY LEADING INDUSTRIES

The principal statistics of the forty leading industries of the province of Quebec are presented in Table 1, for the calendar year 1929. The leading industry of Quebec in 1929 in point of production was that of pulp and paper, with railway rolling stock, cotton yarn and cloth industry in third place.

FORTY LEADING INDUSTRIES

The principal statistics of the forty leading industries of the province of Quebec are presented in Table 1, for the calendar year 1929. The leading industry of Quebec in 1929 in point of production was that of pulp and paper, with railway rolling stock industry in second place and the cotton yarn and cloth industry in third place. The capital investment, the central electric stations ranked first with pulp and paper second, and cotton yarn and cloth third. The forty industries represented 79.1 per cent of the total number of establishments reported for the province, whilst capital investment was 86.9 per cent, employees 81.5 per cent, salaries and wages 82.1 per cent, cost of materials 82.7 per cent and value of production 83.1 per cent.

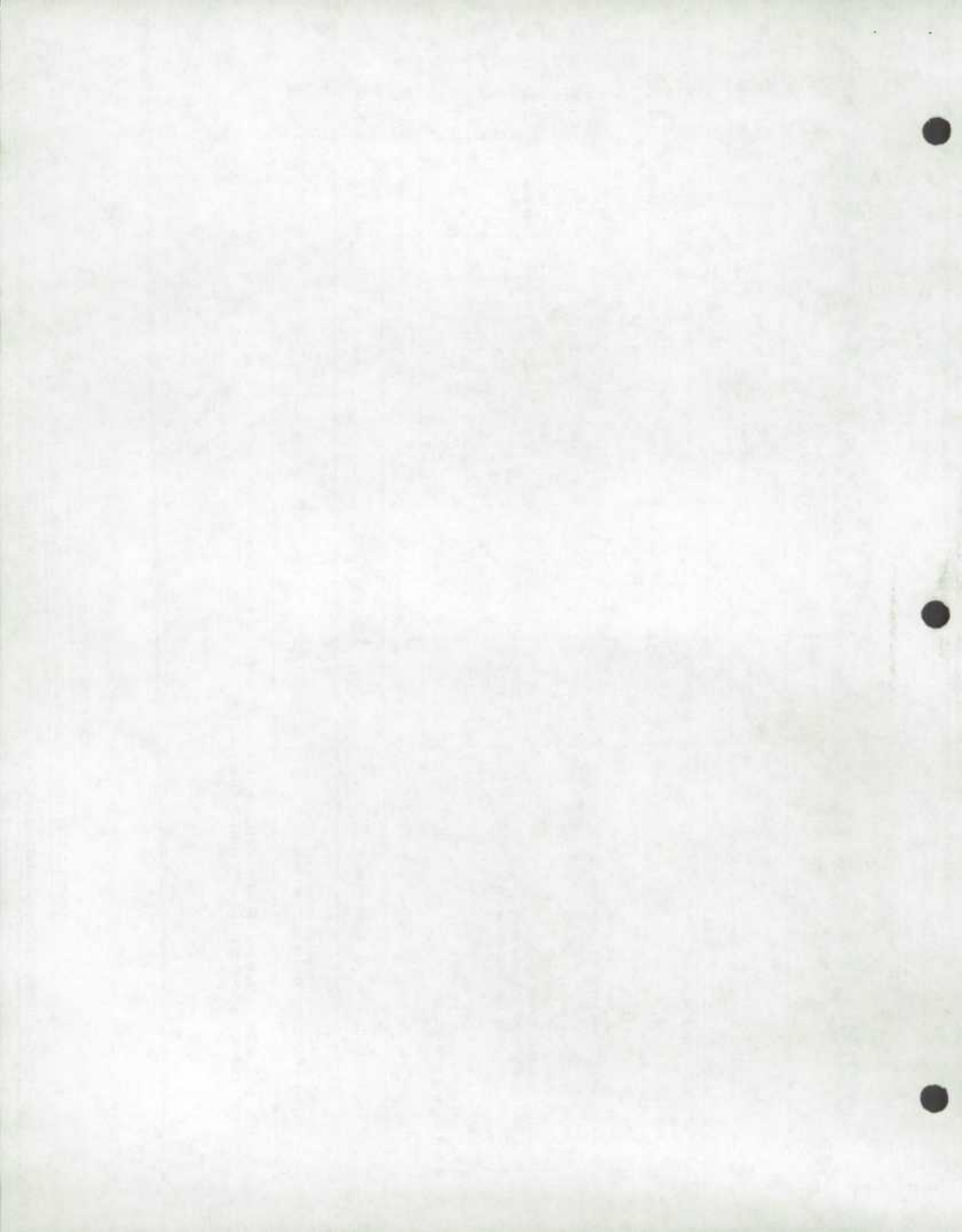

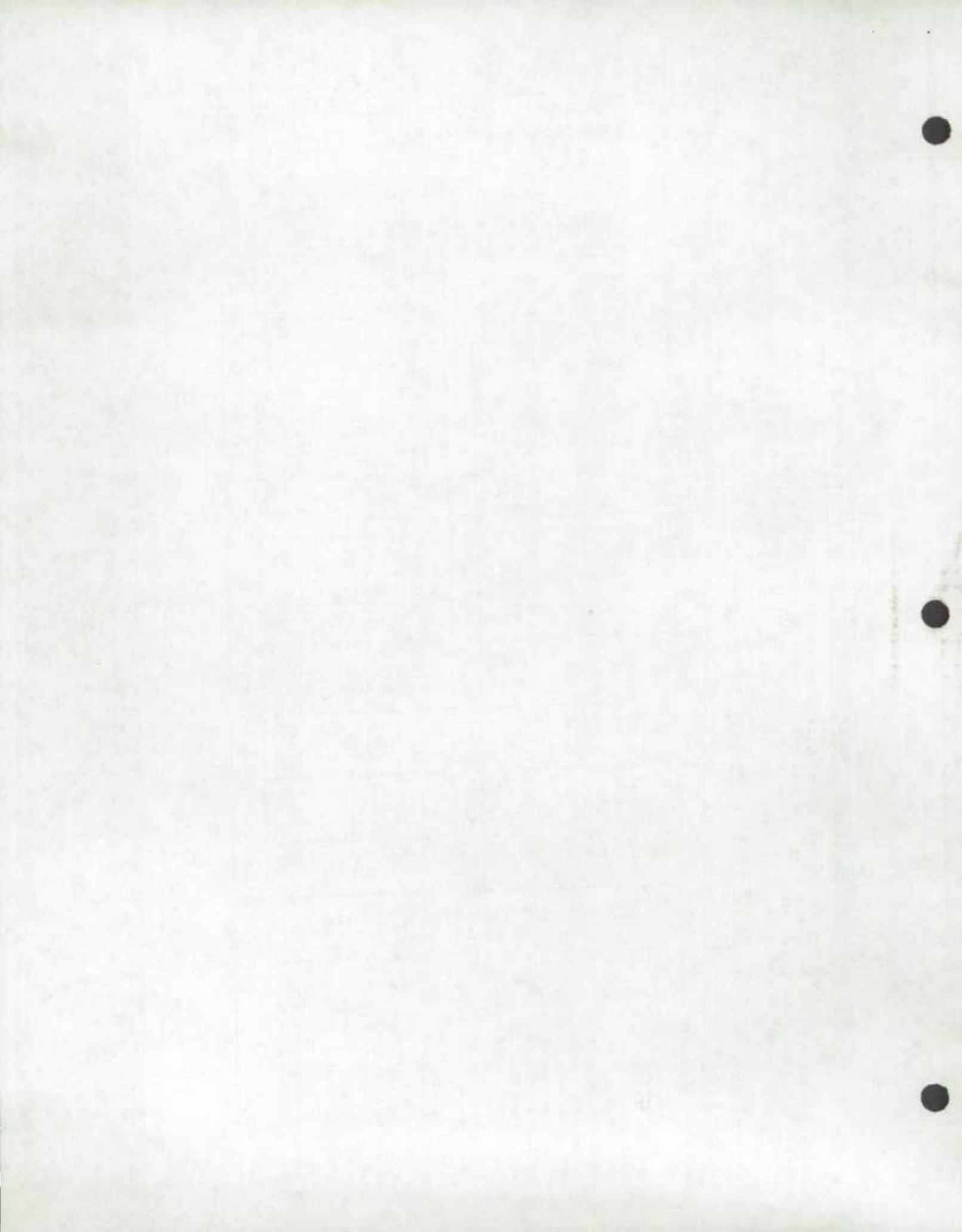

PRINCIPAL STATISTICS OF MANUFACTURES BY GROUPS OF INDUSTRIES, 1928 and 1929.

Table 2. shows the principal statistics of the ten groups into which all industry has been divided. The vegetable products group occupies first place during both years in value of production, followed in order by the wood and paper and textile groups. In employment the textile group in 1929 stood in first place with the wood and paper group second, the iron and steel products third and the vegetable products group fourth. In capital investment the wood and paper group was first, the central electric stations second and the textile group third.

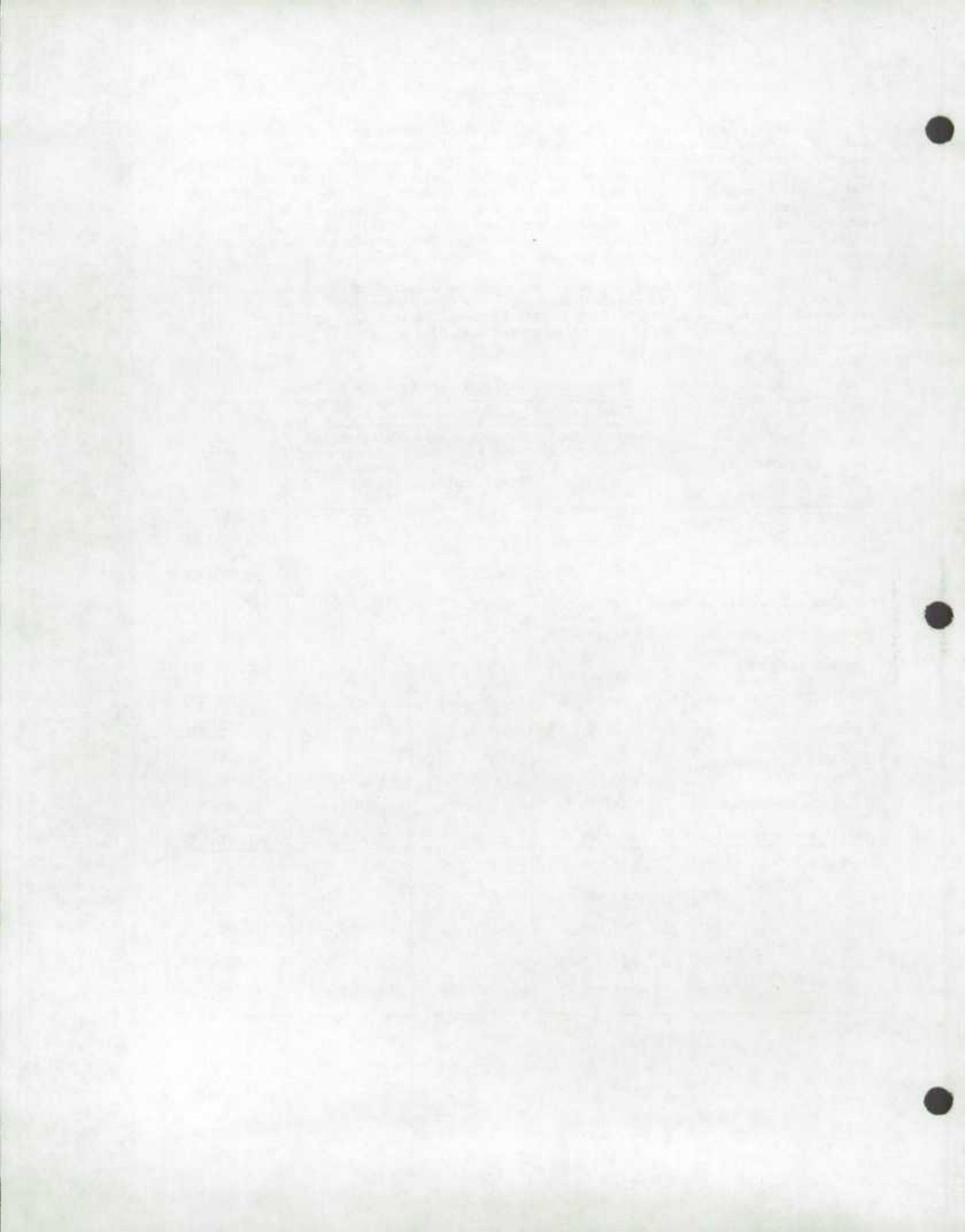
CAPITAL INVESTMENT.

The statistics of the capital investment in the manufacturing industries of the province of Quebec are presented in Table 4, for the calendar years 1925-1929. The statistics are given under two main heads - fixed capital which includes land, buildings, machinery and tools and working capital which includes (a) materials and stocks on hand, fuel and miscellaneous supplies on hand and (b) cash, trading and operating accounts and bills receivable. It will be noted that the wood and paper group employed the largest amount of capital viz. \$466,651,022 or 27.9 per cent of the total, followed by the central electric stations with \$421,000,578 or 25.2 per cent and the textile products group with \$167,194,334 or about 10 per cent of the total investment.

The statistics of capital investment covering a period of five years are also shown in Table 4. It will be observed that there has been an upward trend in both fixed and working capital. Compared with 1925, fixed capital has increased by 34.5 per cent and working capital by 26.2 per cent or an increase of 32.1 per cent of the total investment.

EMPLOYEES, SALARIES AND WAGES, 1929.

The number of persons employed by classes and sex is shown by groups of industries in Table 5. Employment is highest in the textile group with 49,138, the wood and paper group being next with 48,507, followed in order by the iron group, the vegetable group and the animal group. The textile group moreover is the highest employer of female labour; of all the females employed in the manufacturing industries of the province of Quebec 50 p.c. are found in this group.

The average salaries and wages for Canada and the province of Quebec are compared in the statement following and shows that while the average salary is higher in Quebec by \$34., the average wage falls below the Canada by \$79, and in the combined salary and wage average by \$77.

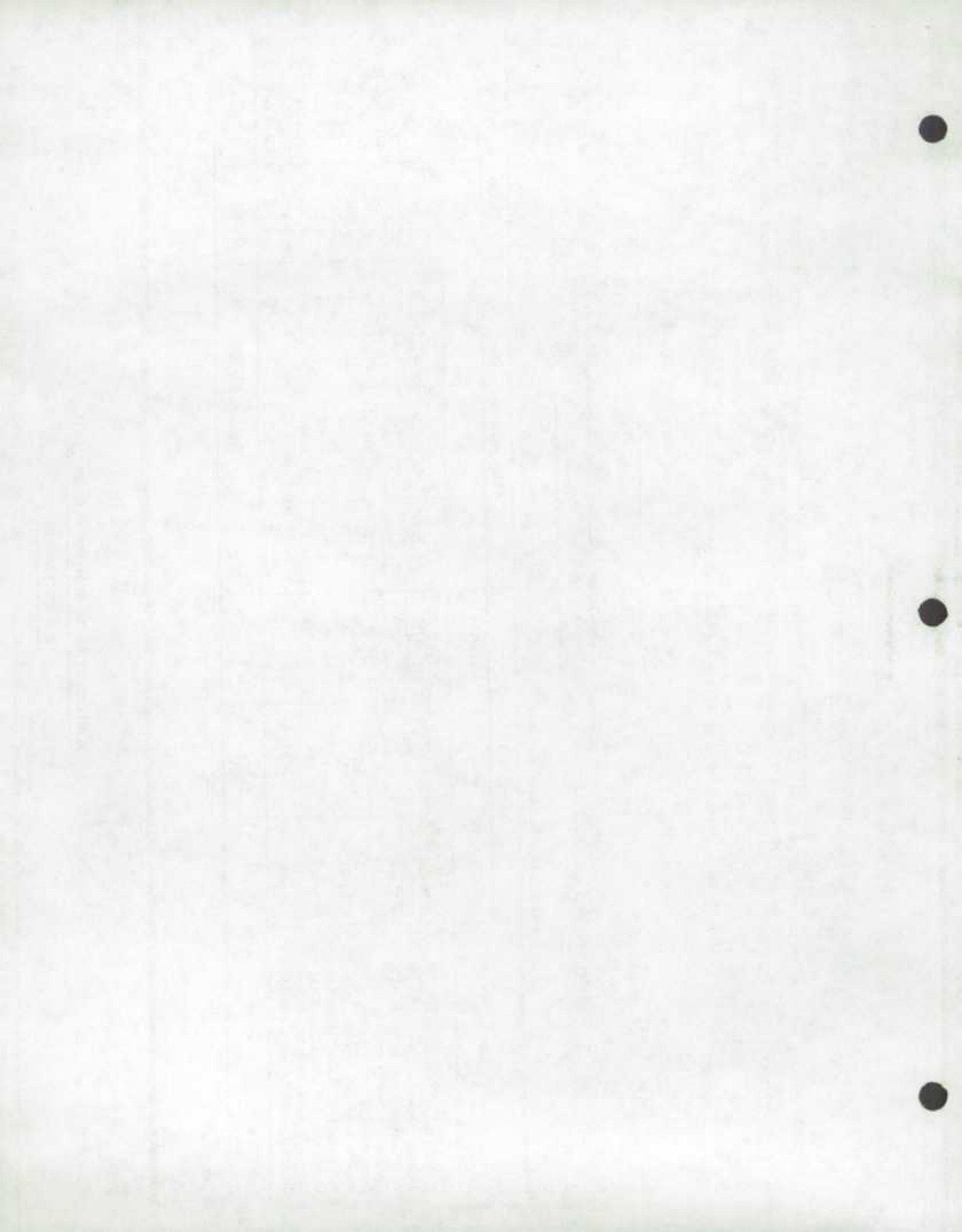

The quantity and the cost value of the works of the various classes of fuel consumed by the industries of the Province of Quebec in 1929 are shown in Table 6.



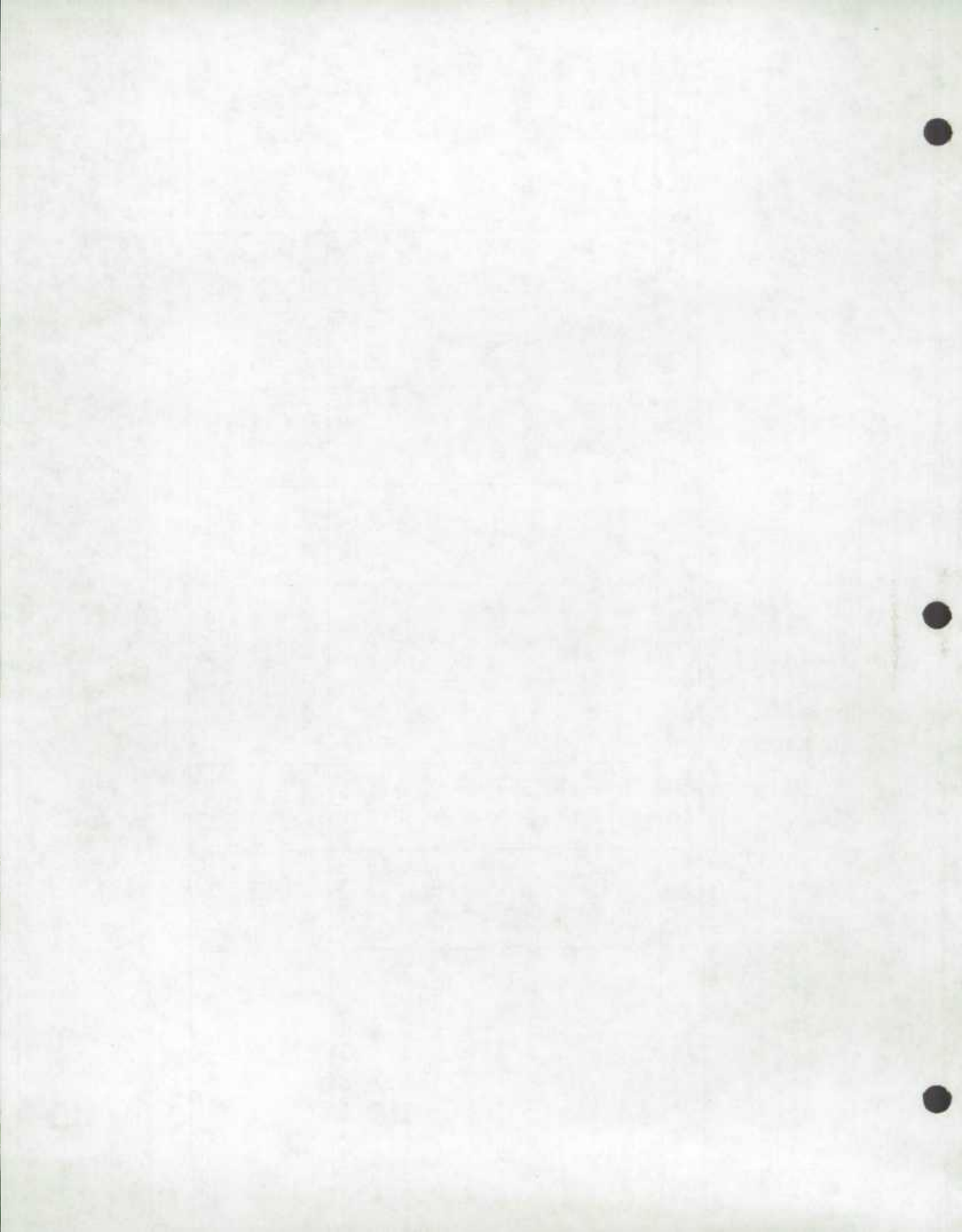

FUEL CONSUMPTION

The quantity and the cost value at the works of the various classes of fuel consumed by the industries of the Province of Quebec during the calendar year 1929 are shown in Table 6. The total cost of all fuel amounted to \$17,613,796 and of this total \$13,342,920 or nearly 75.8 per cent represented the cost of coal of all kinds. Oil for fuel stands second in importance with an outlay of \$2,337,402 or 13.3 per cent of the total cost. Wood takes third place with an expenditure of \$709,505 followed in order of importance by gas \$611,930, other fuel \$101,996, coke \$424,047 and gasoline \$85,996. There was an increase in the cost of fuel consumption as compared with 1928 of \$293,486.

POWER EQUIPMENT IN INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF QUEBEC.

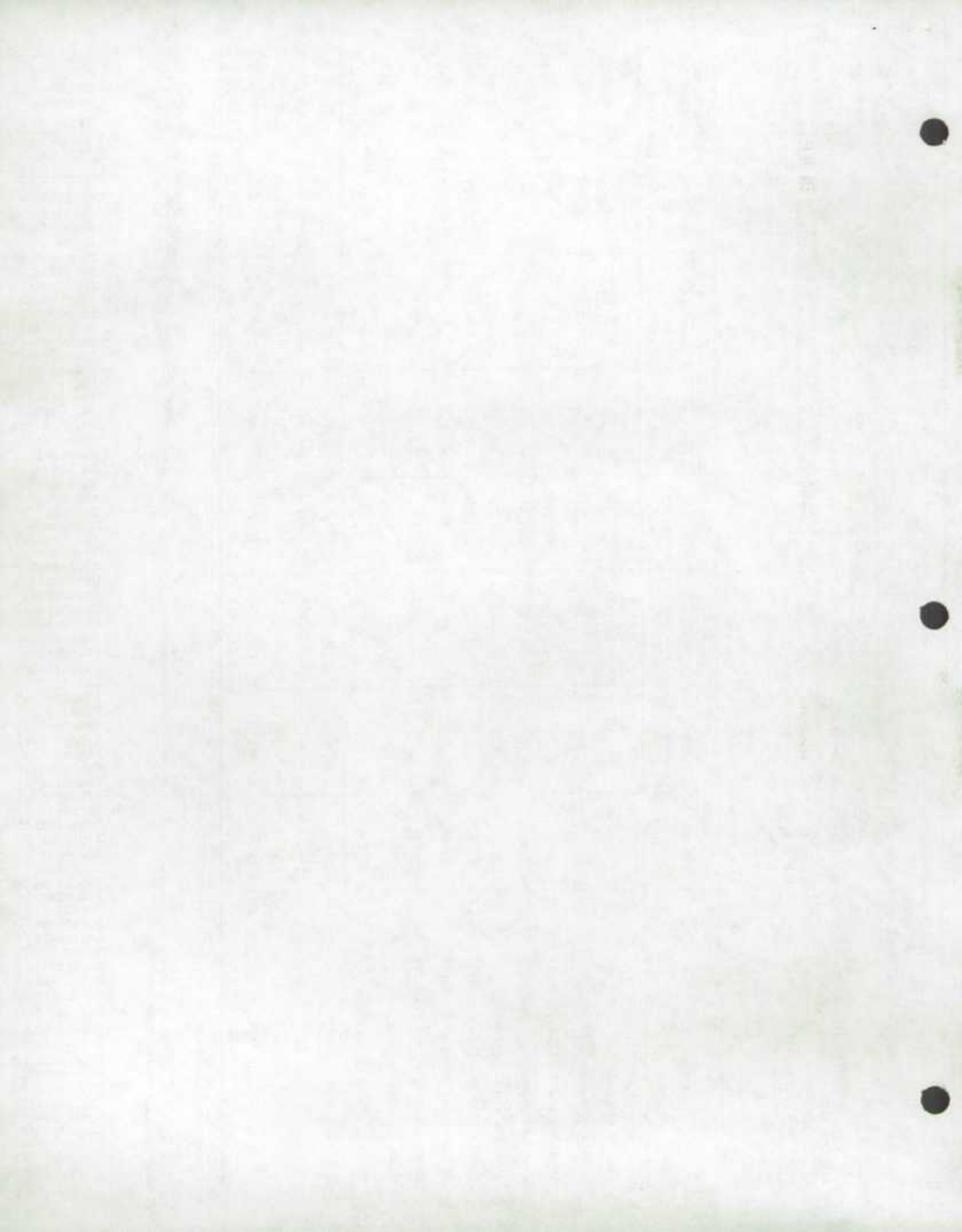
The statistics of power equipment installed in the manufacturing industries of the Province of Quebec are shown by groups of industries for the calendar year 1929 in Table 7. Power developed by steam increased by 4,791 h.p., by water 155,626 h.p., and by internal combustion engines by 731 h.p. Electric motors in industry are of two classes, the first being those driven by purchased power and the second those driven by power generated by the establishment. In 1929 there was an increase in the first class of 50,182 h.p. or 5.3 per cent, as compared with the preceding year and an increase in the second class of 6,622 h.p. or 5.9 per cent. The cost of electricity purchased during 1929 for power amounted to \$16,260,491, as compared to \$14,951,806 in 1928.

Table 8. shows the principal industrial statistics for cities and towns in the province whose production exceeded one million dollars in 1929. The total gross value of production of the urban centres amounted to \$1,045,455,904 in a total for the entire province of \$1,160,612,992, representing approximately 90 per cent. The manufactured products of the City of Montreal represented 54.9 per cent of the total for the province.
