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MANUFACTURING STATISTICS OF THE PROVINCE OF QUEBEC, 1931.

Manufacturing production in 1931 continued in a downward direction. While the province of Quebec felt the continued decline in industrial activity experienced by the manufacturing industries of Canada in 1931, this decline was not, however, as great as that experienced by the province of Ontario. In Quebec the number of employees decreased by 11.7 per cent, the salaries and wages paid by 13.6 per cent and the gross value of products by 16.9 per cent. This compares with decreases in Ontario of 12.3 per cent in the number of employees, 15.4 per cent in the salaries and wages paid and 23.4 per cent in the gross value of products.

In 1931, reports were received from 7,505 manufacturing establishments in the province of Quebec. They produced finished merchandise valued at the factory at \$849,154,353. Their capital investment amounted to \$1,662,811,076 and they furnished employment to 180,808 persons who were paid \$187,362,564 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used was \$369,044,132, while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$480,110,221.

Compared with 1930 there was an increase of 95 in the number of establishments reporting with a decrease of \$64,253,312 in the capital invested. The value of production declined by \$173,126,334, the number of persons employed by 23,994 and the salaries and wages paid by \$29,473,111. The cost of materials used was \$93,200,146 lower and the value added by manufacture was \$79,926,188 lower. These variations may be noted in detail in tables 1 and 2.

The large decrease in the number of employees in 1931 is not, however, entirely due to the decline in manufacturing production. The decrease is in part due to the change in method of computing the average annual employment of wage-earners. Between 1925 and 1930 the average was obtained by summing the averages of individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation and not by dividing by 12 the sum of the monthly employment figures. For example, if a plant operated only during three months of the year with an employment of 100 persons the first month, 125 the second month and 75 the third month, its average annual employment was taken as 100 ($300 \div 3$); the same as that of another plant which operated the whole year with an average employment of 100 persons per month. In 1931, however, a change was made to the old method, whereby the aggregate of the monthly figures is divided by 12. This method gives the man year that each plant operates. The change in method, therefore, affects the average annual employment as well as the average wages paid in seasonal industries, such as fruit and vegetable canning, fish canning, sawmills, etc.

Provinces where seasonal industries predominate, therefore, show a proportionately greater decrease in the number of employees in 1931 as compared with the decrease in the salaries and wages paid, while industries that operate throughout the entire year are not affected by this change.

Table 3 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1930 and 1931. From the standpoint of gross value of products, the vegetable

products group headed the list with an output valued at \$182,370,156, the corresponding figures for 1930 being \$216,899,777. Other important groups in 1931 were wood and paper products with an output of \$158,944,598; textiles and textile products, \$149,947,453; iron and its products, \$83,881,624 and animal products, \$78,287,924. It will be observed that in all these groups production showed a heavy decline in comparison with 1930. The wood and paper products group reported the biggest decline, viz., \$53,370,719, while the output of central electric stations was only \$1,190,600 lower.

Table 4 reviews the principal statistics of the forty leading industries of Quebec in 1931. In value of production, the pulp and paper industry heads the list with an output valued at \$85,162,453. Other leading industries were tobacco, cigars and cigarettes (\$65,566,797), central electric stations (\$42,010,665), non-ferrous metal smelting and refining (\$34,242,461), cotton yarn and cloth (\$30,749,771), railway rolling stock (\$29,874,473), women's factory clothing (\$28,755,336), etc.

Table 5 reviews the principal statistics of the individual industries which make up the various groups shown in table 3.

Table 6 covers the principal statistics of all cities and towns in Quebec which had a production valued at more than \$200,000. The city of Montreal with a production of \$438,237,287 leads by a very large margin, accounting for 51.6 per cent of the entire output of the province.

In table 7 are given the principal statistics of the industries located in Montreal, classified according to the value of the products made.

Details of capital investment by industrial groups are shown in table 8 for 1931. Of the total capital of \$1,662,811,076, \$1,237,515,652 represents investments in land, buildings, machinery and tools and is a decrease of \$22,433,325 from the corresponding figures for 1930. The inventory value of finished products on hand amounted to \$74,838,228, while raw materials, stocks in process, fuel and miscellaneous supplies on hand were valued at \$145,272,273. The corresponding figure for these two items in 1930 was \$257,923,102. Cash, bills and accounts receivable, prepaid expenses, etc., amounted to \$205,184,923 in 1931, a drop of \$4,007,386 from the 1930 figures.

The quantity and value of fuel consumed and the power equipment of the manufacturing industries of the province of Quebec are shown in tables 9 and 10 respectively.

^x The increase in the number of salaried employees and salaries paid is due to the following changes made in the instructions accompanying the schedules.

1. - Prior to 1931, owners who were working as ordinary wage-earners, such as small bakers, reported themselves as wage-earners. In 1931, however, all such owners were required to report themselves as salaried employees.
2. - In 1931, travelling salesmen who were attached to the plant and devoted all or the greater part of their time in selling the products of that plant were included with salaried employees. Prior to this they were not reported at all.
