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MANUFACTURING STATISTICS OF THE PROVINCE OF QUEBEC, 1932.

Manufacturing production in 1932 continued in a downward direction. While the province of Quebec felt the continued decline in industrial activity, this decline was not, however, any greater than that experienced by the province of Ontario. In Quebec the number of employees decreased by 10.8 per cent as compared with the previous year, salaries and wages decreased by 19.2 per cent and the gross value of products by 21.3 per cent. This compares with decreases in Ontario of 11.4 per cent in the number of employees, 18.3 per cent in the salaries and wages paid and 21.6 per cent in the gross value of products.

In 1932, reports were received from 7,851 manufacturing establishments. They produced finished merchandise valued at the factory at \$668,417,093. Their capital investment amounted to \$1,632,955,979 and they furnished employment to 161,439 persons who were paid \$151,481,138 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used was \$292,203,152, while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$376,213,941.

Compared with 1931 there was an increase of 346 in the number of establishments reporting with a decrease of \$29,855,097 in the capital invested. The value of production declined by \$180,737,260, the number of persons employed by 19,369 and the salaries and wages paid by \$35,881,426. The cost of materials used was \$76,840,980 lower and the value added by manufacture \$103,896,280 lower. These variations may be noted in detail in tables 1 and 2.

The large decrease in the number of employees in 1931 and 1932 is not, however, entirely due to the decline in manufacturing production. The decrease is in part due to the change in method of computing the average annual employment of wage-earners. Between 1925 and 1930 the average was obtained by summing the averages of individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation and not by dividing by twelve the sum of the monthly employment figures. For example, if a plant operated only during three months of the year with an employment of 100 persons the first month, 125 the second month and 75 the third month, its average annual employment was taken as 100,  $(300 \div 3)$ , the same as that of another plant which operated the whole year with an average employment of 100 persons per month. In 1931, however, a change was made to the old method, whereby the aggregate of the monthly figures is divided by twelve. This method gives the man year that each plant operates. The change in method, therefore, affects the average annual employment as well as the average wages paid in seasonal industries, such as fruit and vegetable canning, fish canning, sawmills, etc.

Provinces where seasonal industries predominate, therefore, show a proportionately greater decrease in the number of employees in 1931 and 1932 as compared with the decrease in the salaries and wages paid, while industries that operate throughout the entire year are not affected by this change.

Table 3 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1931 and 1932. From the standpoint of gross value of products, the textile group headed the list with an output valued at \$131,178,148, the corresponding figures for 1931 being \$149,947,453. Other important groups in 1932 were: vegetable products with an out-

put of \$129,314,333; wood and paper products \$119,926,463 and animal products \$64,474,727. It will be noted that in all these groups production showed a heavy decline in comparison with 1931. The vegetable products group reported the biggest decline, viz., \$53,055,823 and also dropped from first to second place. The output of central electric stations was, however, \$2,709,739 higher in 1932 as compared with the previous year.

Table 4 reviews the principal statistics of the forty leading industries of the province of Quebec in 1932. In value of production, the pulp and paper industry heads the list again with an output valued at \$63,317,497. Other leading industries are: central electric stations (\$44,720,404), non-ferrous metal smelting and refining (\$35,141,813), tobacco, cigars and cigarettes (\$31,923,004), cotton yarn and cloth (\$26,974,004) and women's factory clothing (\$23,193,839).

Table 5 reviews the principal statistics of the individual industries which make up the groups shown in table 3.

Table 6 covers the principal statistics of all cities and towns in the province of Quebec with three or more establishments. The city of Montreal with a production of \$310,502,225 leads by a very wide margin, accounting for nearly 50 per cent of the entire output of the province exclusive of central electric stations.

Table 7 gives the principal statistics of the industries located in Montreal, classified according to the value of the products made.

Details of capital investment by industrial groups are shown in table 8 for 1932. Of the total capital of \$1,632,955,979, \$1,280,486,275 represents investments in land, buildings, machinery and tools. The inventory value of finished products on hand amounted to \$58,391,114, while raw materials, stocks in process, fuel and miscellaneous supplies on hand amounted to \$119,858,790. Operating capital, consisting of cash, bills and accounts receivable and prepaid expenses, totalled \$174,219,800.

The quantity and value of fuel consumed and the power equipment of the manufacturing industries of the province of Quebec are shown in tables 9 and 10.
