The Dominion Bureau of Statistics has prepared a general review of the statistics of the manufacturing industries in the Dominion for the calendar year 1918, covering the operations of 35,797 establishments, located by provinces as follows:- Ontario 15,365, Quebec 10,540, Nova Scotia 2pl25, British Columbia 1,786, Manitoba 1,444, Saskatchewan 1,422, New Brunswick 1,364, Alberta 1,252, Prince Edward Island 484, and the Yukon 15.



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
