STOCKS OF RAW HIDES AND SKINS IN CANADA

September, 1942

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics presents herewith one of a series of monthly reports based on information secured for the Wartime Prices and Trade Board showing stocks of raw hides and skins on hand in Canada. The figures contained in the table represent the total demestic and foreign stocks held at the end of the month by tanners, packing plants and dealers in hides and skins. Figures in the tables include all domestic stocks in transit to Canadian firms and also any sheep and lamb skins, goat and kid skins of foreign origin which may be in transit. The figures do not include foreign captle hides, calf or kip skins in transit to Canadian firms but such items are mentioned in a footnote to the table.

Stocks of raw cattle hides hold by tanners, packers and dealers in Canada amounted to 425,524 at the end of September, 1942, compared with 441,015 at the end of August, 1942, and 489,297 at the end of September, 1941. Total stocks on hand at the end of September, 1942, were made up of 321,521 hides of domestic origin, and 104,003 hides of foreign origin. The domestic stock included 209,094 packer or small packer and 112,427 country hides.

Calf and kip skins on hand increased from 869,323 at the end of August, 1942 to 881,132 at the end of September, 1942. Stocks of other types at the end of September, 1942 included 81,418 dozen sheep and lamb skins, 65,884 goat and kid skins, and 17,156 herse hides.
