
MONTHLY REPORT OF THE BOOT AND SHOW PRODUCTION OF CANADA, DECEMBER, 1926.

Statistics of the production of boot and shoe factories for the month of December, 1926, are based on the returns of 167 plants out of a total of 169 plants in operation during the month. Two factories in Quebec failed to make return. The output of leather footwear in December shows a slight decrease compared with the proceding month, the production totalling 1,474,439 pairs compared with 1,525,739 pairs in November. The total quantity of felt footwear made was 136,750 pairs, an increase over the proceeding month of 1,473 pairs. The returns show increases in the output of leather footwear for men, boys and youths, and babies and infants, and decreases in production of footwear for women and misses and children. The numbers of pairs under each of these classifications, in comparison with the figures for the proceeding month are as follows, the statistics for November being within brackets: men's 478,213 (443,243); boys' and youths', 171,607 (149,556); women's, 544,548 (630,309); misses' and children's, 173,899 (200,681); and babies' and infants', 106,172 (101,945). the classification according to process of manufacture shows increased production for wolts and stitchdowns and decreased production for the other items.

The cumulative production of leather and felt footwear (exclusive of larrigans and shoepacks, and Indian slippers and moccosins) for the 12 months ending December 31, 1926, was 18,693,189 pairs, an increase over the output for 1925 of 2,141,390 pairs, or 13 p.c. The following table gives the total production of footwear in 1926, by months.
