MONTHLY REPORT OF THE ECOT AND SHOE PRODUCTION OF CANADA, AUGUST, 1926.

The statistics of book and shoe production for the month of August are based on the returns of 161 factories out of a total of 167 factories in operation during the month. Three factories in Quebec, and I factory each in Nova Scotia, Ontario and British Columbia failed to make return. The output of the factories in August was slightly less than that of the preceding month. The number of pairs of boots and shoes with leather or fabric uppers made during August was 1,406,728 compared with 1,485,225 pairs in July. The classification by kinds shows increased output of boots and shoes for men and for boys and youths, and decreased production in the numbers of pairs of boots and shoes for women, misses and children, and babies and infants. Classified according to process of manufacture, increases are shown for Welts, McKays, including imitation welds and Pegged, screw or wire fastened; while decreased production is noted for Turns and Stitchdowns. The production of felt footwear and cloth slippers for house wear increased from 55,376 pairs in July to 124,439 pairs in August. The total production of footwear for each of the months January to August is shown in the following table:

The cumulative production of boots, shoes and slippers for the 8 months ended August 31, 1926, was 12,031,542 pairs, or an average monthly production of 1.503,943 pairs. The average production per month for the year 1924, the latest year for which complete statistics are available, was 1,420,896 pairs.
