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## REPORT OIT THE ZRODUCTION OF BOOTS AND SHOES INT CAITADA, OCTOBER, 1927.

The statistics of the boots and shoo production of Canada for the month of October are based on the returns of 173 factories out of a total of 177 factories in oporation during the month. The factories in operation are located by provincos as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; Now Brunswick, 5; Fucbec 104; Ontario, 59; Manitoba, 1; Alborta, 1 ; and British Columbia, 5. Throe factorios in Quebec and 1 factory in Ontario failed to naze returns. The output of the factorios during the month shows a. total of 1,711,244 pairs of footwear, comprising 1,494,838 pairs of boots and shoos :'ith leathor or fabric uppers; 70,470 pairs of shoepacks, larrigans and moceasins; 98,890 pairs of footwar ith folt uppors; and 46,956 pairs of slippers of various kinds. The production of boots and shoes with leather or fabric uppers shams a decrease from the preceding month of 53,751 pairs, or 3 per cent, and a decrease from the month of October, 1926 , of 106,138 pairs, or $6 \frac{1}{2}$ per cent. Boots and shoes for men. for womon and for babies and infants show decreased production from the preceding month, while increases aro rcoorded in the sizes for boys and youths and for misses and children. The classification according to process of manufacture shows increases over the proceding month in the roduction of "turns" and "stitchdowns", with decreasos for "wolts", "fcKays and imit tion welts" and "nailed, pegged, screw or mire fastencd." Incruascs are recorded in the production of shoepacks, larrigans and moccasins, and slipmors, while a decrease is shown for felt footwear. The total production of footwear for the month of October, 1927, shows a decrease from the procoding month of 8,449 pairs or .05 per cont.

The cumulative production of footrent for the 10 months onded October 31 , 1927. Wos $16,279,019$ pairs, comprising $14,911,018$ pairs of boots and shocs \%ith lonther or fabric unpers, 296,284 pairs of shoepacks, larrigans and moccasins; 706,765 pairs of footwoar with felt uppers; and 364,952 pairs of silppers. The average per month for $a l l$ footrear for the 10 months' poriod of 1927 was $1,627.902$ pairs, compared with an avorage per month for the 12 months of 1926 (as shown by the annual roport on the boot and shoe industry) of $1,658,045$ pairs.
