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SEPORT ON THE PRODUCTICN OF BOOTS AND SHOES IN CANADA, NOVEMBER, 1927.

The statistics of production of the leathee boot and shoe industry of Canada for the month of November, 1927, are based on the returns of 171 factories out of a total of 177 factories in operation during the month. The factorios in operation are located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; New Brunswick, 5; Quebec, 105; Ontario, 58; Manitoba, 1; Alberta, 1; and British Columbia, 5. Tour factories in Quebec and 2 in Ontario failed to make return.

Production for the month totalled $1,615,667$ pairs of boots and shoes, comprising 1,408,979 pairs of boots and shoes with leather or fabric uppers; 30,316 pairs of shoepacks, larrigans and moccasins; 113,554 pairs of footwear with felt uppers; and 62,818 pairs of slippers of various kinds. The total production of footwear shows a decrease from the preceding month of 95.577 pairs, or $5 \frac{1}{2}$ per cent. The classification of boots and shoes with leather or fabric uppers shows a decrease from the preceding month of 85,859 pairs, or $5 \frac{1}{2}$ per cent, and a decrease from the month of November, 1926, of 116,750 pairs, or $7 \frac{1}{2}$ per cent. The items of footwear with felt uppers and slippers show increases over the preceding month, while the production of shoepacks, larrigans and moccasins shows a decrease. Comparison with the month of November, 1925, cannot be made for these last three items, as no information regarding thom was collected in the monthly returns for that year. In comparing the output of boots and shoes with leather or fabric uppers for November, 1927, with that of the preceding month, the most important decrease is show to have been in the production of shoes for women, the decrease amounting to 74,201 pairs, or 11 per cent. The production of shoes for men dom creased by only 14,657 pairs, or 3 per cent, while shoes for boys and youths and misses and children show increased production. The decrease in the production of momen's shoes from the month of November, 1926, was 57.524 pairs, or 9 per cont, while the decrease in the production of men's shoes was only 175 pairs.

The cumulative production of footwear for the 11 months onded Nevember 30,2927,
 was $17,894,686$ pairs or an avorage per month of 3191,224 paine The total production of foctwear for the calendar year 2926, according to the annual roport on the industry, Has $19,896,539$ pairs, or an average per month of $1,658,045$ pairs.
