RRPORT ON THE PRODUCTION OF BOOTS AND SEORS
IN CANADA, DECMMBER, 1928.

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Number of Factories.- The statistics of the present report are based on the returns of 170 factories out of a total of 175 factories in operation during the month. The factories in operation are located by provinces as follows - Nova Scotia, 3; New Brunswick, 3; Quebec, 103; Ontario, 59: Manitoba, 2; and British Columbia, 5. Four factories in Queboc and one factory in Ontario neglectod to make return.

Production. - The output of the leather footwear industry in December, 1928, amounted to $1,260,576$ pairs, comprising $1,074,643$ pairs of boots and shoes with leather or fabric uppers; 24,283 pairs of shoepacks, larrigans and moccasins; 106,704 pairs of footwear with felt uppers; and 54,946 pairs of slippers. Each of these items shows a decrease from the preceding month, the decrease for all kinds amounting to 294,891 fedrs, or 19 p.c. Compared with the month of December, 1927, a decrease is shown of 361,956 , or 22 p.c.

Cumulative Production. - The total quantity of leather footwear manufactured during the 12 monthe ended December 31, 1928, based on the monthly returns, was $20,005,363$ pairs. This compares with a cumulative production of $19,517,218$ pairs for the 12 months of 1927, but with a production according to the annual census for 1927 of $20,567,765$ pairs. The difference is explained by the fact that the annual census takes account of every ostablishment in operation during the year, while for the monthly record, there are usually lacking the rettrins of 5 or 6 establishments. Also in the annual census the manufacturer is at liberty to fumish return for his business year instead of for the calendar year, and this would account for a part of the difference shown between the annual census figure and the result of the cumulative monthly production figure.

Imports and Exports.- The imports of leather footwear, comprising boots and shoes with leather, canvas and felt uppers, in December, 1928, totallod 114,913 pairs, compared with 218,413 pairs in the preceding zonth and 120,716 pairs in December, 1927 . The quantity of Canadian made leather footwear exported in December, 1928, was 3.968 pairs, compared with 15,774 pairs in the preceding month and 8,172 pairs in December, 1927. The imports for the 12 months ended December 31,1928 , totalled $1,493,597$ patrs, compared with $1,237.963$ pairs in 1927 ; and the exports 140,638 pairs, compared with 116,645 pairs in 1927.
