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## RTPORT ON THE PRODUCTION OF BOOTS AND SHOES IN CANADA, FEBRUARY, 1928.

The statistics of production for the month of February, 1928, are based on the returns of 173 factories out of a total of 179 factories in operation during the month. Five factories in Quebec and 1 factory in Ontario failed to make return. The factories in operation are located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 1: New Brunswick, 5: Quebec, 107; Ontario, 59; Manitoba, 1; Alberta, l; and British Columbia. 5.

The production of leather footwear for the month of February shows an increase of 12 per cent over the preceding month and an increase of 10 per cent over February, 1927. The total number of pairs of footwear produced in February, 1928, was $1,665,304$, compared with $1,482,914$ in the preceding month and $1,510,942$ pairs in February, 1927. The total for February, 1928, comprises 1,511,255 pairs of boote and shoes with leather or fabric uppers; 42,104 pairs of shoepacks, larrigans and moccasins; 62,953 pairs of footwear with felt uppers; and 48,992 pairs of slippers of various kinds. Compared \#ith the preceding month, the largest percentago of increase is shom in the production of footwear for women, which increased from 545,428 pairs in January to 687,513 pairs in February, an increase of 142,090 pairs or 26 por cent. The production of footwear for men increased by 2 per cent; of footizear for boys and youths by 5 per cent; of footwear for misses and children by $5 \frac{1}{2}$ per cent; and of footrear for babics and infants by 15 per cent.

The cumulative production of footivear for the 2 months ending February 29. 1928. was $3.148,218$ pairs, compared with a total of $2.918,105$ pairs for the corresponding period of 1927.
