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REPORT CN RHE PFODUCTION OF BOOTS AND SHOES IN CANADA,

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\text { MAY, } 1928 .
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Statisiics of production of the leather boot and shoe industry for the menth of May, 1928, are based on the returns of 179 factories out of a total of 285 factories in operation during the month. By provinces, the factories in operation during the month were as follows: Nova Scotia, 4; New Brunswick, 4; Quebec, 109; Ontario, 61; Manitoba, 1; Alberta, 1; and British Columbia, 5. It might be noted that one company formerly operating in New Brunswici has moved to Nova Scotia, and its factory is included for May with the number shown for Nova Scotia.

The production of footwear for the month of May shows a slight falling off from thet of the preceding month, but a gain over that of the month of May, 1927. The total production for May, 1928, was $1,697,259$ pairs, a decrease of 14,284 pairs, or less than 1 p.c., from the production for April, and an increase of 93, 373 pairs, or $5 \frac{1}{2}$ p.c., over the month of May, 1927. Compared with the precoding month, the production for May, 1928 shows increased production in footwear for men, women and babies and infants, with decreased production for the class iftcations of footwear for boys and youths, and misses and children. The production of footwear for momen represented $41 \mathrm{p} . c$. of the total production of footwear for the month, and the production of footwear for men, 29 p.c.

The cumulative production of footwear for the 5 months ended May 3lst, 1928, amounted to $8,504,400$ pairs, conpared with a total of $7,876,322$ pairs for the corresponding 5 months of 1927. The average monthly production for the first 5 months of 1928 was $1,700,880$ pairs, compared with an average of $1,575,264$ pairs in the corresponding period of 1927.
