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## REPORT O.. FIT PRODUCTION OF BOOMS ND SNOTS <br> 

Number of Factories. The statistics of the present report are based on tine returns
 factories in Quebec and one factory in Ontario failed to make return. The factories in operation during the month mere located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 4; New Brunswick, 3; Quebec, 107: Ontario, 61; Manitoba, 2; and Britiain Columbia 6.

Production.- The production of footwear for the month of september, 1928, amounted to $1,643,759$ pairs, comprising $1,402,515$ pairs of boots and shoes with leather or fabric uppers; 30,822 pairs of shoejecks, larrigans and moccasins; 128,763 pairs of footwear With felt uppers; and 81,659 sirs of slippers. Procuction for tire month shows a decrease of 136,205 pairs, or 10 pec., from tine preceding month and a decrease of 75,934 pairs, or $4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. f from the month of September, 1927. The classification according to sizes shows decreases from the receding mont? in tie quantity of footwear made for men, for women, and for misses and children, within increases in the sics bor boys and youths and for babies and infants. The classification by process of manufacture shows decreases in each of the several kinds. In the miscellaneous kinds of footrest, the items of shoepacks, larriscins and moccasins and footwear mitis felt uppers show decreases, while an increase is recorded in the item of cloth, carpet, boudoir and Indian slippers.

Cumulative Production.- The cumulative production of footwear for the 9 month ended September 30,1928 , was $15,350,696$ pair g, or an average per month of $1,705,633$ pairs, compared with a total of $13,416,180$ pairs and an average of $1,618,642$ pairs for the corresponding period of 1927.

Average Production jer Factory. The average reduction per factory reporting. in September, 1928 , was 9,287 airs, compared with 10,281 pairs in the preceding months and 10,116 pairs in the month of September, 1927.

Imports and Exports.- The intort of boots and shoos mith leather uppers duftag the month of September, 1923, amounted to 107,191 pairs, compered with 91.954 pairs in August. Tho quantity of C in ian made leather footwear exported in September Was 10,815 pairs, compar od with 10,327 in the precoding montiz. For the month of September, 59 pec. of the footwear exported went to the United States, 20 .c. to

Now Zealand and It pec. to IVevioundland.
