REPORT ON THE PRODUCTION OF BOOTS AND SHOES III CAMADA, CHPTEMBER, 1928

Number of Factories .- The statistics of the present report are based on the returns of 177 factories out of a total of 10 factories in operation during the month. Five factories in Quebec and one factory in Ontario failed to make return. The factories in operation during the month were located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 4; New Brunswick, 3; Quebec, 107; Ontario, 61; Manitoba, 2; and British Columbia 6.

Production .- The production of footwear for the month of September, 1928, amounted to 1,643,759 pairs, comprising 1,402,515 pairs of boots and shoes with leather or fabric uppers; 30,822 pairs of shoepacks, larrigans and moccasins; 128,763 pairs of footwear with felt uppers; and 81,659 pairs of slippers. Production for the month shows a decrease of 186,205 pairs, or 10 p.c., from the preceding month and a decrease of 75,934 pairs, or 4 p.c., from the month of September, 1927. The classification according to sizes shows decreases from the preceding month in the quantity of footwear made for men, for women, and for misses and children, with increases in the sizes for boys and youths and for babies and infants. The classification by process of manufacture shows decreases in each of the several kinds. In the miscellaneous kinds of footwear, the items of shoepacks, larrigans and moccasins and footwear with felt uppers show decreases, while an increase is recorded in the item of cloth, carpet, boudoir and Indian slippers.

Cumulative Production - The cumulative production of footwear for the 9 months ended September 30, 1928, was 15,350,696 pairs, or an average per month of 1,705,633 pairs, compared with a total of 13,416,180 pairs and an average of 1,618,642 pairs for the corresponding period of 1927.

Average Production per Factory .- The average production per factory reporting in September, 1928, was 9,287 pairs, compared with 10,281 pairs in the preceding month and 10,116 pairs in the month of September, 1927.

Imports and Exports .- The import of boots and shoes with leather uppers dufing the month of September, 1928, amounted to 107,191 pairs, compared with 91,954 pairs in August. The quantity of Canadian made leather footwear exported in September was 10,815 pairs, compared with 10,327 in the preceding month. For the month of September, 59 p.c. of the footwear exported went to the United States, 20 p.c. to New Zealand and 14 p.c. to Newfoundland.


