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REPORT ON THE PRODUCTION OF BOOTS AND SHOES
IN CANADA, OCTOBER, 1922.
Number of Factories.- Statistics of the production of leather footwear in Canada for the month of October, 1929, are based on the returns of 178 factories out of a total of 184 factories in operation during the month. The factories which furnished returns are located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 1; New Brunswick, 3; Quebec, 103; Ontario, 62; Manitoba, 2; and British Columbia; 7. Five factories in quebec and 1 factory in Ontario failed to make return.

Production. The output of the industry for the month of October amounted to $1,936,372$ pairs, exceeding the output of the preceding month by 198,433 pairs, or 11 per cent; and the output of the month of October, 1928 , by 97,748 pairs, or 5 per cent, and creating a record as the highest monthly production in the 10 month period of 1929 . It is also the second largest production show for any month of the period January, 1926, to October, 1929, the record being held by March, 1928, when $1,947,380$ pairs were mamfactured. Footwear made in sizes for women during the month of October, 1929, totalled 875,572 pairs, representing 45 per cent of the output of all footwear for the month, and footwear in sizes for men, 581,033 pairs, or 30 per cent of the total. In the production of shoes for women the process of "Mckays and all imitation welts" is of chief importance, While the process of "Welts" occupies first place in order of quantity in the production of footwear for men. The process of "Stitcheorns" is used chiefly in the manufacture of shoes for misses and children and babies and infants.

Cumulative Production n - The total output of the industry for the 10 months ended October 31, 1929, was $16,756,333$ pairs, an average per month of $1,675,633$ pairs, compared With a total of $17,189,320$ pairs, and an average per month of 1,718,932 pairs for the corresponding period of 1928 .

Imports and Exportsom The imports of footwear (not including rubber) into Canada in October totalled 217,143 pairs, compared with 166,985 pairs in the preceding month and 158,616 pairs in October, 1928. The export of Canadian made leather footwear was more than double that of the preceding month but was less than that of October, 1928 , the figures for the three periods being as follows: October, 1929: 10,101 pairs; September, 1929, 3,497 pairs; and October, 1928, 10,176 parse
