Number of Factories.- Returns of production of leather footwear for the month of December, 1929, were received from 177 factories out of a total of 184 on the 11 at of footwear manufacturers. Mae distribution by provinces is as follows: Nova Scotia, 1; New Brunswick, 4; Quebec, 101; Ontario, 62; Manitoba, 2; and Britisir Columbia, 6. Five factories in quebec and one factory each in Ontario and British Columbia failed to make reply to tine questionnaire sent out by the Bureau.

Production:- The usual seasonal decline is shown in tie production of leather footwear for the month of December. The total output amounted to $1,317,755$ pairs, a decrease of 155,985 pairs from time preceding month, but an increase of 57,180 pairs over tine month of December, 1928. The larger part of the decrease comes from tie item of footwear for women, which dropped from 597,512 pairs in November to 484,296 pairs in December, a decrease of 113,216 pairs, or 19 per cent. Footwear for men, of the other hand, increased from 430,125 pairs in November to 434,688 pairs in December, an increase of 4,563 pairs, or 1 per cent. The output of footirear for women in December, 1929, represents 37 per cent of total production, and footwear for men, 33 per cent of the total.

Cumulative Production. - The production of footwear for the 12 months ended. December 31, 1929, as based on the monthly returns, was 19.547 .830 pairs, compared wit: a cumulative production of $20,005,363$ pairs for the corresponding period of 1928 and with a total production as shown by tine annual census of the latiner footwear industry for tie year 1928 of $20,793,757$ pairs. The difference beween cumulative production based on the monthly returns and final figures sion by the annual census is explained by the fact that the annual census includes a return from every operating factory, will tine monthly record usually lacks the returns of 5 or 6 establishments. It is expected therefore that tine final figure of production for 1929 will be in excess of the figure sion in in tie present report.

Imports and exports. - The quantity of footwear (except rubber) imported Into Canada in December, 1929, amounted to 66,664 pairs, compared with 152,359 pairs in tie preceding month and 95,462 pairs in December, 1928. The number of pairs of Canadian made leativer footwear exported in December, 1929, was 3,450, compared with: 5,053 pairs in November and 3,968 pairs in December, 1923.
