REPORT ONT TIE PRODUCIION OR BOOIS AND SHOES IN CANADA， February，1929．

Number of Factorios－Returns of production for the month of February， 1929 Were received from 184 boot and shoe factories out of a total of 187 factories in operation during the month．One factory each in Nova Scotia，Quebec and Ontario failed to make return．The factories reporting operations are located by provinces as follows： Nova Scotia，2；New Brunswick，3；Quebec，110；Ontario，62；Manitoba，2；and British Oolumbia， 5.

Production．－The production of leather footwear in Canada in February，1929， amounted to $1: 555.378$ pairs，an increasr over the preceding month of 245,901 pairs， or 18 p．c．，but a decrease frcm the month of February， 1928 of 79.926 pairs，or $4 \frac{1}{2}$ p．c． Boots and shoes wi h leatiaer or fabric uppers show a total output in February，1929，of 1，467，175 pairs，an increase over the preceding month of 215,425 pairs，or 17 p．c．，b $t$ a decrease frcm the month of February， 1928 ，of 56,830 pairs，or $3 \frac{1}{2}$ p．c．Attention is called to the corrected statement of production for the month of Jonuary，1929，attached horetc．An error was mado by ono of tho firms reporting for that month which necessitated changes in several items，and it was thought best to issue a new statement，which may be substituted for the page 2 of the January Report．

Quroulative Production．－The cumulative production for the two months onded February 2d．1929，was $2,924,555$ pairs，a docrease of 223,363 pairs，or $6 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$ ．from the corresponding perłod of 1928．Production of footwear for misses and childron shows an increase over the two months of 1928，while all of the other items of size show decreases．

Imports and Exports．－The quantity of foot car（oxcopt rubbor）imported into Canada during the month of Fobruary，1929，totalled 72,931 pairs，compared with 51,827 in the procoding month and 60ै，091 pairs in February，1929．These totals comprisc footwoar r：ith I cathor uppurs，fcotwcar with canvas uppers and footwear with felt uppers．Exports of Canadian mado leather footroar in February，1929，amounted to 1,461 pairs，compared 17ith 2，611 pairs in the procoding ronth and 3，121 pairs in Fobruary， 1928 ．
