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## REPORT ON THE PRODUCTION OF BOOTS AND SHOES IN CANADA


March, 1929.

Number of Factories.— The statistics of the present report are based on the returns of 181 factories out of a total of 187 factories in operation during the month. The factories which furnished returns are located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; New Brunswick, 3; Quebec, 107; Ontario, 63; Manitoba, 1; and British Columbia, 5. Returns are lacking for 1 factory in Nova Scotia, 4 factories in Quebec and 1 factory in Ontario.

Production.— The production of all kinds of leather footwear in March amounted to 1,712,852 pairs, an increase over the preceding month of 127,474 pairs, or 8 p.c., but a decrease from the month of March, 1928, of 234,528 pairs, or  $13\frac{1}{2}$  p.c. The number of pairs of footwear made in sizes for women in March, 1929, was 732,538, or 43 p.c. of the total output of footwear for the month; the number of pairs made in sizes for men, 490,889 or 29 p.c. of the total output; in sizes for misses and children, 250,816, or 14 p.c. of the total; in sizes for babies and infants, 123,871, or 7 p.c. of the total; and in sizes for boys and youths, 114,738, or 7 p.c. of the total.

Cumulative Production. The total production of footwear for the three months ended March 31, 1929, amounted to 4,637,707 pairs, compared with 5,095,598 pairs during the corresponding period of 1928. Decreases are shown for all classifications of footwear, both according to size and to process.


