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RHPORT ON THE FRODUCTION OF BOOTS AND SHOES

IN CANADA, JULY, 1929.
LAERAREY

Number of Factories.- The report on the production of boots and shoes in Canada for the month of July, 1929, is based on the returns of 179 factories out of a total of 184 factories in operation during the month. Four factories in Quebec and 1
factory in ontario falled to make return. The factories in operation during July are located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; New Brunswick, 3: Quebec, 107: Ontario, 63; Manitoba, 2; and British Columbia, 7.

Production. - The output of footwear in July amounted to $1,688,035$ pairs, an increase over the preceding month of 118,459 pairs or $7 \frac{1}{3}$ p.c., and an increase over the month of July, 1928, of 55.159 pairs, or $3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total for July, 1929, comprises 520,089 pairs of fontwear made in sizes for men, an increase over the preceding month of 18妾 p.c.: 753,246 pairs in sizes for women, an increase of 9 p.c.; 95.978 pairs in sizes for boys and youths, an increase of $7 \frac{1}{8}$ p.c.; 198,843 pairs in sizes for misses and children, a decrease of 12 p.c.; and 119,978 pairs made in sizes for babies and infants, a decrease of $3 \frac{1}{2} p . c$.

Qumulative Production.- The output of the factories for the 7 months ended July 31. 1929. totalled 11,227,249 pairs, on average per month of $1,603,893$ pairs, compared with a total of $11,876,972$ pairs and an average per month of $1,696,710$ pairs for the corresponding period of 1928 。

Imports and Exports. - The quantity of footwear with leather, felt and canvas uppors imported into Canada during the month of July, 1929 , was 132,419 pairs, an increase over the preceding month of 12,048 pairs, or $10 \mathrm{p.c}$. , but a decrease from the month of July, 1928, of 69,785 pairs, or $34 \frac{3}{3}$ p.c. The exports of canadian made leather footwear amounted to only 5,487 pairs, compared with 12,103 pairs in the preceding month and 11.545 pairs in July, 1928.
