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RHFORT ON TEE PROUUCMION OF BOOTS AND SHOES
IN CANADA, AUGUST, 1929
Zumber of Factories.- The statement of production of leather footwear for the month of August, 1929, is based on the returns of 178 factories out of a total of 184 factories in operation during the month. The factories in operation were located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; Nen Brunswick, 3; Quebec, 109; Ontario, 62; Manitoba, 2; and Eritish Columbia, 6. Four factories in Quebec and 1 factory each in Ontario and Manitoba failed to make return.

Production:- The production of leather footmear in August, 1929, amounted to $1,854,773$ pairs, an increase over the preceding month of 166,738 pairs, or $9 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. , and an increase over the month of August, 1928 , of 24,809 pairs, or 1 p.c. The August production is higher than that of any previous month of the year 1929, and is greater by over 100,000 pairs that the former high record of March. The quantity of shoes made in sizes for women accounted for 46 p.c. of the total production in August, 1929, and the quantity in sizes for men, 32 p . c. The remaining output was divided as follows: 10 p.c. in sizes for misses and children; 6 p.c. in sizes for boys and youths; and 6 p.c. in sizes for babies and infants.

Cumulative Eroduction.- The total output of the factories for the 8 months ended August 31,1929 , amourted to $13,082,022$ pairs, or an average per month of $1,635,252$ pairs, compared with a total of $13,706,937$ pairs and an average per month of $1,713,367$ pairs for the correspondinz period of 1928 .

Inports and Exports.- The quantity of footwear with leather, canvas and felt upoers imported into Canada during the month of August, 1929, totalled 157,157 pairs, compared with 132,419 pairs in July and 165,587 pairs in August, 1928 . The exports of Canadian made leather footvear amounted to 5,989 pairs, compared with 5.487 zairs in July and 10, 327 pairs in August, 1928.
