RTIPORT ON THE PRODUCIION OF LEATHER FOOIWEAR IN GATADA,
November, 1930
Number of Factories.- Statistics of the production of leather boots and shoes In Canada in November, 1930, are based on the returns of 158 factories out of a total of 165 factories in operation during the month. Mio plants in operation are located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; New Brunswick, 4; Quebec, 96; Ontario, 55; :ianitoba, 2; and British Columbia, 6. Six factories in Quebec and one factory in Ontario failed to make return. There were eight factories (seven in Quebec and one in Ontario) Which were closed temporarily during the month of November.

Production.- Consequent upon the amaller number of factories in operation there was a consiciorable decrease from the preceding month in the quantity of output. The total number of pairs of leather footwear manufactured during the month of liovember, 1930, was $1,124,798$, compar ed with $1,552,392$ pairs in October and $1,473,741$ pairs in jovamber, 1929. Novambor always shows a seasonal decline in production, and the decrease from the monti of October, 1930, represents about the same percentage of decrease as in provious years. Production for botin October and ivovember, 1930, however, is the lowest recorded for these months in any one of tine past five years.

Cumulative Production.- The total production of lcather footwear in Canada for the eleven months onded Novamber 30, 10j, Tas $16,023,190$ pairs, or an average per month of $1,456,654$ pairs, compared with a total of $18,230,074$ pairs and an average per month of $1,657,279$ pairs for the corresponding poriod of 1929 .

Imports and Fxports.- Tho ounntity of footmenr (exclusive of rubber goods) imported into Canadi during the month of November, 1930, amounted to 123,396 pairs, compered with 146,977 prirs in October and 152,359 pairs in Novembar, 1929. Decr eases from the proceding moith are shown for all of the different items in the importation of footwear, excepting that of "boots, shoes and slippers with leathor uppers, in sizes for men", which shoms a slight increasc. The exports of Canadian made loather footwear in November, 1930, amounted to only 2,677 pairs, comparod with 6,172 pairs in the preceding month and 5,063 pairs in November, 1929.
