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SEPORT ON THE PRODUCTION OF LEATHER FOOTTEAR IN CANADA, DECEMBER, 1930.
Wumber of Factories.- Statistics of the production of leather footwear in Canada for the month of December, 1930, are based on the returns of 150 factories out of a total of 157 factories in operation during the month. The operating factories were located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; New Brunswick, 4; Quebec, 88; Ontario, 55; Manitoba, 2; and British Columbia, 6. Six factories in Quebec and one factory in Ontario failed to make return. There were also six factories (five in Quebec and one in Ontario) which reported that their plants were closed temporarily during the month.

Production. - The production of leather footwear in Canada in Decemver, 1930, amounted to $1,064,192$ pairs, compared with $1,124,798$ pairs in November, and 1,317,756 pairs in December, 1929. The output for the month of December, 1930, is the lowest recorded for any month of that year. December was the month of lowest production also in each of the two preceding years.

Cumulative Production. - The total production 0 leather footwear in the 12 months ended December 31. 1930, amounted to $17,087,382$ pairs, compared with a total of 19,547,830 pairs in the 12 months of 1929. The returns of the annual census of the leather boot and shoe industry for the year 1929 gave a total of $20,459,737$ pairs. The difference in quantity between the figure of the annual census and that of the cunulative production shown by the combined totals of the monthly returns is accounted for by the fact that the annual census includes a return for every boot and shoe factory in operation during the year, whereas each monthly report lacks the returns of from four to seven factories, and the production of these delinquent factories combined for the 12 months would represent a considerable amount. It may be anticipated therefore that the returns of the census of the industry for 1930 will show an increase over the figure now given of the result of the compilation of the monthly returns. The present report shows, on page 3, the cumulative production for the 12 months of 1929, and on page 4, the production of 1929 according to the annual census.

Imports and Exports.- Imports of footwear with leather, canvas and felt uppers during the month of December, 1930, amounted to 59,444 pairs, compared with 123,396 pairs in the preceding month and 66,664 pairs in December, 1929. For the calendar year 1930 the imports totalled $1,430,896$ pairs, compared with $1,452,521$ pairs in 1929. The number of pairs of Canadian made leather footvear exported in December, 1930, was 2,472 compared With 2,677 pairs in November, and 3,450 pairs in December, 1929. The total exports for the year 1930 amounted to 79,340 pairs, compared with 99,247 pairs in 1929. The figures of exports given above do not include moccasins and Indian slippers, of thich the total exports in 1930 amounted to 4,541 pairs and in 1929 to 19,411 pairs.
