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REPORT CM THE PRODUCTION OF BOOTS AND SHOES IN CANADA, APRIL, 1930.

Number of Factories.- Statistics of the production of leather footwear during the month of April, 1930, are based on the returns of 171 factories out of a total of 175 factories in operation during the month. The factories in operation are located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 1; New Brunswick, 4; Quebec, 103; Ontario 60; Manitoba 1; and British Columbia, 6; Three factories in Quebec and 1 factory in Ontario neglected to make return.

Production.- The output of leather footwear during April amounted to 1,574, 405 pairs, a decrease from the preceding month of 20,460 pairs and a decrease from the month of April, 1929, of 69,176 pairs. The average production of footwear in the month of April for the five-year period 1926 to 1930 was $1,604,762$ pairs, the largest output being recorded for April, 1928, (1,711,5431, and the smallest for April, 1926 $(1,527.533)$. Statistics of production according to classification of size and process are given in tables 1 to 4 of the present report, and statistics of total production, by months, for the years 1926 to 1930, in table 5.

Cumulative Production, - The total production of leather footwear for the four months ended April 30, 1930, was 5,849,201 pairs, which falls short of the total for the corresponding period of 1929 by 432,087 pairs. The average monthly production for the period January to April, 1030 , was $1,462,300$ pairs, compared with an average of $1,570,322$ pairs for the first four months of 1929 .

Imports and Exports.- Imports of footwear with leather, felt and canvas uppers into Canada during the month of April, 1930, amounted to 94,770 pairs, a decrease from the preceding month of 28,376 pairs, and a decrease from the month of April, 1929, of 4,515 pairs. Of the total quantity imported 60 per cent came from the United States, and 16 per cent from the United Kingdom. Exports of Canadian made leather footwear in April, 1930, totalled $9: 968$ pairs, compared with 9,381 pairs in March and 9,218 pairs in April, 1929. Most of the goods exported went to the United States.
