Number of Factories.- Statistics of the production of leather footwear in Canada in July, 1930, are based on the returns of 171 factories out of a total of 176 factories in operation during the month. The factories in operation were located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; New Brunswick, 4; Quebec, 106; Ontario, 56; Manitoba, 2; and British Columbia, 6. Four factories in Quebec and one factory in Ontario failed to make return.

Production.- The total output of the factories in July, 1930, amounted to 1,414, 372 pairs, compared with $1,398,444$ pairs in the preceding months and $1,688,035$ pairs in July, 1929. The increase over June is due to the large quantity of slippers, an ooduction of which in July was nearly double that of June. The production of footwear classified as "boots and shoes with leatier or fabric uppers" anounted in July. 1930, to $1,232,993$ pairs, a decrease from the precedine month of about 18,000 pairs. The production of sioopacks, larrigans and moccasins was greater in July than in June, While the production of footwear with felt uppers shows a falling-off of about 12,000 pairs. In the classification of footwear with leather or fabric uppers, production in sizes for men shows an increase over the preceding month of about 34,000 pairs, while production in sizes for women decreased by about 11,000 pairs.

Qumulative Production.- The total production of leather footwear for the seven months ended July 31,1930 , was $10,187,455$ pairs, an average per month of $1,455,351$ notin, \& corpared with a total of 11,227.249 pairs ani an averace per month of $1,603,893$ pairs for the corresponcing period of 1929 .

Imports and Exportg.- The quantity of footwear (exclusive of rubber) imported into Canada durine the month of July, 1930, amounted to 102,060 pairs, compared with 105.564 pairs in the prececing wonth and 132,419 pairs in JuIy, 1929. Leather footwear is of cizief importance with a total inport in July, 1930 , of 71,713 pairs, or 70 per cent of the total quantity of footwear (except rubber) imported in that month. Very little Canadian made leather footwear is exported, the total for July, 1930, amounting to only 2,635 pairs, compared with 5,303 pairs in June and 5,487 pairs in July, 1929 .
