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## REPORT OH TET PRODUCTION OF LEATHER FOOTTEAR IIT CATADA, OCMOBER, 1931.

## Mrmber of Factories.- Statistics of the production of leather footmear

 in Canada 1a October, 1931, are based on the returns of 167 factories out of a total of 172 factories in preration during the month. The operating factories were located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; Now Bmanswick; 4; Quebec, 102; Ontario, 58; Hanitoba, 1; and British Columbia, 5. Four factories in quebec and one factory in Ontario neslected to furnish returns.Productloin-" Footwear made during the month of October, 1931, amounted to $1,55+144$ pairs, a decrease from the preceding month of 118,293 pairs, but an increase over the month of octover, 1930, of 1,752 pairs. Boots and shoes with leather or fabric uppers record an increase over the month of October, 1930 of 31.811 pairs, or 2 per cent; shoepacirs, larrigans and moccasins ( 011 tan), an increase of 108 pairs or $2 \frac{1}{3}$ per cent; and slippers an increase of 45,516 pairs, or 42 per cent. Decreases are shown in the production of roccasins for outdoor wear (other than oil tan), and footwear with felt uppers.

Curulative Production.- The production of footwear during the ten months ended October 31, 1931, anounted to $15,239,386$ pairs, an average per month of $1,528,939$ pairs, compared with a total of $14,595,39$ ? pairs and a nonthly average of $1,489,839$ pairs in the corresponding period of 1930.

## Irports and Exports. - The quantity of footwear (except rubber goods)

 imported into Canada durine the nonth of October, 1931, amounted to 97.167 pairs, a decrease from the preceding month of 7,147 pairs, or 7 por cent, and a decrease from the month of october, 1930 , of 49,810 pairs, or 34 per cent. The value of the october, 1931 imports was $\$ 153,880$, the United States imports accounting for $\$ 83,687$, and the United Fingdom for $\$ 59,293$. The exports of Canadian made leather footmear in October, 1931, totalled 1,287 pairs, compared with 1,829 pairs in the preceling month, and 6,172 pairs in Octojer, 1930.
