> REPORT ON THE PRODUCTION OF LEATHER FOOTWEAR IN CANADA, OF THE FEBRUARY, 1931.


Number of Factories .- Statistics of the production of leather footwear in Canada in February, 1931, are based on the returns of 166 factories out of a total of 171 factories in operation during the month. The operating factories were located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; New Brunswick, 4; Quebec, 102; Ontario, 56; Manitoba, 1; and British Columbia, 6. Four factories in Quebec and one factory in Ontario neglected to furnish return. There were also 3 factories (1 each in Quebec, Ontario and Manitoba) which reported the temporary closing of plant during the month.

Production .- A large increase over the preceding month is shown in the February output of this industry, the total quantity of leather footwear manufactured during the month amounting to 1,276,965 pairs, compared with 984,924 pairs in January. The increase is particularly noticeable in the case of footwear for women, the production of which rose from 386,168 pairs in January to 554,616 pairs in February. To the total output of leather footwear in February, the quantity made in sizes for women contributed 43 per cent. Although the output of the factories in February records an increase over the month of January, it falls short of the production for February, 1930, by 169,645 pairs.

Cumulative Production -- The total production of the factories for the two months ended February 28, 1931, was 2,261,889 pairs, compared with a total of 2,679,931 pairs in the corresponding period of 1930.

Imports and Exports .- The imports into Canada of all footwear (except rubber) in February, 1931, amounted to 46,565 pairs, compared with 28,849 pairs in January and 74,401 pairs in February, 1930. Of the total quantity imported in February, 1931, the imports from the United States amounted for 29,609 pairs, or 64 per cent, and from the United Kingdom, 11,216 pairs, or 24 per cent. The quantity of Canadian made leather footwear exported in February, 1931, was 1,053 pairs, compared with 670 pairs in January and 13,777 pairs in February, 1930. The largest shipments in February, 1931, went to the United Kingdom, the United States and New Zealand.




