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## REPORT ON THE PBODUCTION OF 工HATHER HOOTWEAR

IN CANADA，APRI， 1931.

Number of Factories．－Statistics of the production of leather footwear in Canada in April，1931，have been prepared from the returns of 164 factories out of a total of 170 factories in operation during the month．The operating factories were located by provinces as follows：Nova Scotia，2；New Brunswick， 4；Quebec，100；Ontario，57；Manitoba，1；and British Columbia，6．Five factories in Quebec and one factory in Ontario failed to reply to the Bureau＇s questionnaire．

Production．－The April，1931，output was slightly under that of the preced－ ing month，but was greater than that of April，1930．The production of all classes of leather footwear in april，1931，amounted to $1,669,917$ pairs，compared with 1，729，930 pairs in March，and 1，574，405 pairs in April，1930．Footwear for women in April，1931，represented 45 per cent of the totel output for the month； footwear for men， 26 per cent；for misses and children， 15 per cent；for babies and infants， 8 per cent；and for boys and youths， 6 per cent．

Qumulative Production．－The total production of footwear for the four months ended April 30，1931，amounted to $5,661,736$ pairs，or an average per month of $1,415,43$ pairs，compared with a total of $5,849,201$ pair ad an average per month of $1,462,300$ pairs in the corresponding period of 9930 ．

Imports and Exports：－The imports into Canada of footwear（except rubber） in April，1931，amounted to 81,208 peirs，a decrease from the preceding month of 5,116 pairs and a decrease from the month of April，1930，of 13．562 pairs． Shown in dollars，the total imports in April，1931，had a value of $\$ 179,899$ ． compared with $\$ 235,162$ in March and $\$ 281,271$ in April，1930．The imports from the United States in April，1931，were valued at $\$ 114,505$ ，from the United Xingdom at $\$ 38,309$ ，and from other countries at $\$ 27,085$ ．The quantity of Canadian made leather footwear exported from Carada in April，1931，amounted to 1，593 pairs，compared with 2，006 pairs in March and 9,968 pairs in April， 1930．The United States in April， 1931 ，took 508 pairs；Trinidad and Tobago， 465 pairs；St．Dierre and Miquelon， 249 pairs；the United Kingdom， 193 pairs； and other countries， 178 pairs．
