Mumber of Factories. - Statistics of the Production of leather footwear in Canada in May, 1931, are based on, the returns of 163 factories out of a total of 167 factorias in operation during the month. The operating factories were located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 2; New Brunswick, 4; Quebec, 96; Ontario, 58; Manitoba, 1; and British Columbia, 6. Three factories in Quebec and one factory in Ontario neglected to furnish returns.

Production. - The output of the factories in May 1931, amounted to 1,740,792 pairs, an increase over the preceding month of 70,875 pairs and an increase over the month of May. 1930, of 215,854 pairs. It is larger also than the output of any previous May back to 1927, the first year for which monthly statistics are availaile. Footwear under the classification of (a) boots and shoes with leather or fabric uppers shows an increase over the preceding month of 76,526 pairs, but decreases are recorded for shopacks, larrigans and moccasins, footwear with felt uppers and slippers of all kinds. The production of footwear for women in Lay, 1931, represented 47 per cent of the total output of that month.

Qumulative Production.- The total production of leather footwear for the five monthe ended iay 31st, 1931, was $7,402,528$ pairs, or an average per month of $1,480,505$ pairs, comoaren wity a total of $7,374,139$ pairs and a monthly average of $1,474,828$ pairs for the corresponding feriod of 1930.

Imports and Exports.- The imports of leather footwear into Canada in Hay, 1231, were down consideraily in cormarison with the imports of a year ago, and were less alsffan the month of April, 1931. The total imports of leather footwear in May, 1931, amounted 76,860 pairs, compared with 81,208 pairs in April, and 195,306 pairs in 1tay, 1930. The values of the imports for the respective months were $\$ 175,286$ in May, 1931; $\$ 179,899$ in Ajril, 1931; and 301,420 in May, 1930. Imports from the United States in May, 1931, had a total value of $\$ 109,151$ and from the United Kingdan, $\$ 31,695$. The quantity of Canadian made leather footwear exported in May, 1931, totalled 1, 292 pairs, compared with 1,593 pairs in April, and 11,937 pairs in May, 1930.
