

CONSUMPTION, PRODUCTION AND INVENTORIES OF RUBBER

The statistics made available monthly in this report are considered to represent clearly and accurately (a) the new domestic production of synthetic and reclaim rubber, and the inventories of firms reporting production and (b) the total consumption of all types of rubber, natural, synthetic and reclaim, whether foreign or domestic, by broad end product use groupings, together with inventories, receipts and sales by consuming manufacturers in all industries. The addition of the two inventories gives the total stocks held by industry.

It is regretted that comparable export-import data cannot be secured each month, and that, therefore, the total available supply is not accurately known. However, the data given in (b) do ultimately account for the total consumption of rubber in Canada, and should be capable of being correlated with new production and export-import data (as compiled by the External Trade Branch, D.B.S.) over a period of months.

Consumption of rubber in February 1954 as compared with January 1954 shows an increase in natural of 974,034 pounds, and increase in synthetic of 1,089,666 pounds and an increase in reclaim of 300,539 pounds, the total increase being 2,364,-239 pounds. Considering the situation in terms of end products use, it may be noted that the consumption of all rubber in the production of tires and tubes, including tire repair materials, increased by 1,196,807 pounds, consumption in rubber footwear increased by 458,166 pounds, in wire and cable increased by 43,573 pounds and in other products increased by 665,693 pounds, making the total increase of 2,364,239 pounds mentioned above.

Section D. Reclaim Rubber

Table 10 gives the consumption of Reclaim in total only, by end product classification February 1953 to February 1954. Of the 2,803,078 pounds consumed in February 1954, 66,218 pounds were consumed in the form of dispersions and 2,736,860 pounds as other than dispersions. For summary data on Reclaim and other rubber stocks, domestic production and domestic consumption expressed in long tons, see Table 1.
