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THE IFATHER TAINING JNDUSTMY IN CANAIIA

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The leather tanning industry in canada was carried on by 139 establishments during 1918. This shows an increase of three over 1917. Seventy-seven of these plants were located in Ouebec, Forty-six in Onterio, six in Nova Scotia, thres ir Mantoba, two in atch of the Provinces of New Brunswick, Alberta, and Drition Columbin and one in Prince Edward Island.

The total $\forall a l u e$ of the products turned out by this industry during the year was . $\$ 33,070,003.0$. 1713 sum, \$8, 121, 587 was reported as the selling value, at the dactory, of sole lenther: $47,758,669$ of upper leather; and $\$ 7,79 \%, 2,71$ of harmess leather. All the other kinds of leather made had a total selling value of $\$ 8,234,029$, a large portion of mideh might re cursidered as belonging in one of the above classes, thoubh it mas not so reforted by the manufacturers. In addition to the leather protueod, large quantities of by-products such as wool, heir, and Elvessiock, were Do tiained. These by-products had a selling value at thr frotory of ?2, 218,443. The average number of pusins omployed in the industry
1.928, was 3722 , while waeses and salurjes amountad to $43,454,345$ a ver sapita payment of \$930.91. In 1917. \$3,26J, 206 was paid to 4128 ,ersons; a per capita payment of $\$ 700$.

The following table gives tho distribution and classificstion of the persons employed in the indistwy in December, the month in which the largest number of age-earners were at work. It will be noted that the total number of employees as shown in the table exceeds the average number employed during the year.

## EUET

The fuel used in this industry, exclusive of any supplied to employees, cost $\$ 476,302$ laid down at the plants. Of this sum, 4103, 626 was paid for 55,637 tons of bituminous conl of verious srides, ance ${ }^{2} 21,544$ for 3562 tons of anthracite, chiefly dust or slacle.
