



The Leather Industry of Canada, 1922.

Introduction

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues annually a report on the leather-industry of Canada, based on the returns of tanneries in operation during the year. The present report covers operations during the year 1922, and detailed statistics of capital, employees, materials used, products, etc., for that year are given by provinces in the general tables. Summaries of the principal data for 1922 with comparative statistics for the two previous years are given in the introduction. Statistics of imports and exports are also included in the report.

First

Number of Establishments- The number of tanneries in operation in 1922 was 116 compared with 119 in 1921 and 100 in 1920. The distribution of the tanneries by provinces in the three years is shown in the following table:

Production- The value of production of the tanneries in 1922 was \$24,291,684 compared with \$22,905,523 in 1921 and \$39,967,831 in 1920. These totals are exclusive of the values of hides and skins tanned for customers but include the amounts received by the tanneries for custom work. The total value of the sole leather produced in 1922 was \$9,175,420; of upper leather, \$10,497,813; of harness leather, \$1,845,131; of other leather, \$1,702,162; of wool, hair and glue stock, \$210,834 and of other products, \$280,734. Increases in quantity over 1921 are shown for nearly all kinds of leather. The following table gives by kind, number, area or weight, and value, the different products of the tanneries in 1920, 1921 and 1922.

Capital.—The capital investment of the tanneries in 1922 represented a total value of \$32,818,775, comprising \$9,231,426 the value of land, buildings and machinery; \$15,704,161 the value of stocks in process, and products and supplies on hand; and \$7,883,188, cash and accounts. Comparative statistics for 1922 and the two preceding years are given in the following table:

Time in Operation.—The returns show that 102 tanneries were in operation for periods of 240 days and over, eight for periods of from 180 to 239 days and six for periods of less than 180 days.

Employees.—For the twelve months ending December 31st, 1922, the average number of wage-earners was 3,537 and the total wage bill for the year was \$3,479,553. The salaried employees numbered 317 with salaries of \$823,365—Tables 4 and 5.

Fuel Used.—The total cost of fuel used in 1922 was \$457,549 of which sum, \$422,885 was expended for coal, \$25,817 for coke and \$18,849 for other fuel—Table 7.

Power Equipment.—The electric motors used in the tanneries numbered 717 with a total rated capacity of 10,276 h.p. Other power equipment included 64 steam engines with 5,154 h.p., 113 gasoline and oil engines with 152 h.p., and 3 hydraulic turbines with 255 h.p.—Table 6.

Hides, Skins and Other Materials Used.—The total cost of all hides and skins and partly tanned leather treated during the year, together with tanning materials used, was \$15,754,051, an increase over the previous year of \$597,593. The number of cattle hides used increased from 1,169,684 in 1921 to 1,361,011 in 1922, the average price per pound remaining at 15 cents. The number of calf and kip skins used increased from 926,565 in 1921 to 982,008 in 1922, while the average price per pound decreased from 24 cents to 22 cents.—Table 8.

Custom Tanning.—Information regarding the number and weight of hides and skins tanned for customers is given in Table 9. No values have been placed on the hides and skins in the raw state or as tanned and finished, but the table shows the total amount received by the tanneries for the work done. The amount received for custom work is included as an item of the total value of production of the tanneries.

Imports and Exports.—The value of leather, unmanufactured, exported from Canada during the calendar year 1922 was \$5,091,384 an increase over the previous year of over a million dollars, while the value of the imports decreased from \$4,059,222 in 1921 to \$3,764,929 in 1922.—Tables 10 and 11.


