THE LEATHER INDUSTRY, CANADA, 1925.

INTRODUCTION

Establishments.— There were 104 tanneries in operation in Canada in 1925, compared with 114 in 1924 and 123 in 1923. The decrease in number is accounted for almost entirely by the decrease in the number of small custom tanneries, the establishments engaged in custom work only in 1925 numbering 29, compared with 38 in 1924 and 46 in 1923. The following table shows the location of the tanneries by provinces for each of the three years.

Production.— The total value of output of the tanneries in 1925 was \$26,141,217, an increase over the preceding year of \$485,542, or 2 p.c., and an increase over the year 1923 of \$2,533,489, or 10 p.c. The value of output is the largest since 1920 and exceeds the average of the 5 year period 1921-1925 by \$1,620,811, or 7 p.c. The average value of production per establishment is shown to have risen from \$191,933 in 1923 to \$225,000 in 1924 and to \$251,357 in 1925. Under the head of sole leather, increases are shown in the production of hemlock and union sides, and decreases in the production of oak and chrome sides. For upper leather, increases are recorded for cattle and horse hides, calf and sheep skins and chrome sides, and decreases in the items of patent and enamelled shoe leather, goat skins and wax splits. Increases are shown in the production of harness leather, glove, trunk, bag and pocketbook leather, and bookbinders' leather. Belting leather shows a decrease as well as lace leather. The quantities of hides and skins treated for custom tanning are not shown in the tables of production of the leather industry, but the amount received by the tanneries for the work done is included in the total value of production. <sup>1/</sup> The amount received for custom tanning in 1925 was \$610,741, compared with \$513,624 in 1924 and \$302,958 in 1923. Prices for all kinds of leather averaged about the same in 1925 as in 1924. The following table gives quantity and value of production for 1925 and the two preceding years.

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#### THE LEATHER INDUSTRY, CANADA.

Capital.— The value of the capital investment of the industry was \$30,095,917, distributed as follows: land, buildings and machinery, \$9,130,550; materials on hand, stocks in process, etc., \$14,876,176; and cash and operating accounts, \$6,089,161. The item of materials on hand, stocks in process, etc., shews an increase in value compared with the preceding year of over a million dollars, while the other two items show decreases. An increase of \$64,293 is shown in the total value of capital.

Employees and Salaries and Wages.— A decrease of 73 is shown in the number of persons employed in the industry, the total number recorded for 1925 being 3,834, compared with 3,907 in 1924. The number of salaried employees decreased by 14 and the number of wage-earners by 59. The salaries and wages paid in 1925 amounted to \$4,151,058, a decrease from the preceding year of \$265,514. The month of highest employment in 1925 was December, when 3,674 wage-earners were recorded. January and June were the months of lowest employment with 3,318 and 3,356 employees respectively.

Materials Used.— The total cost value of all hides and skins and tanning materials used was \$17,904,138, an increase over the preceding year of \$1,417,877 or 8½ p.c. Cattle hides are of chief importance with a total value of \$10,073,906, followed by calf and kip skins with \$2,404,737 and sheep skins with \$1,055,836. The number of cattle hides is divided pretty evenly between foreign and domestic hides, the returns showing 716,924 of the former and 776,700 of the latter. With calf and kip skins and sheep skins, the numbers of foreign skins are greatly in excess of the numbers of domestic skins, while in the case of goat skins, all were imported. The value of tanning materials used was \$3,796,849, comprising bark for tanning, \$297,391; tanning extracts, \$1,577,339; tallow and oils, \$706,929; chemicals, dyes, etc., \$866,945; and other tanning materials, \$348,245.

Custom Tanning.— The total amount received for custom tanning was \$610,741, compared with \$513,624 in 1924. The number and weight of the hides and skins treated by the tanners for other firms and individuals are given in table 11, page 12. These hides and skins are not included in the tables of production of the tanning industry, but the amount received for the work is given as an item in the value of production.

Time in Operation and Hours Worked.— A total of 29,836 days in operation on full or part time is recorded for all tanneries, or an average of 286.8 days per establishment, compared with an average of 282.1 days in 1924. The average number of hours per day worked by wage-earners in 1925 was 9.1, compared with 9.0 in 1924. The classification of wage-earners according to number of hours worked per day in month of highest employment shows 612 employees as working 8 hours per day or less; 2,582 working 9 hours; 965 working 10 hours; and 142 working over 10 hours. Tables 8 and 9.

#### IMPORTS AND EXPORTS

The statistics of imports and exports in the present report are given according to the calendar year 1925 and are not strictly comparable with those contained in the previous year's report, which were for the fiscal year. The total value of Canadian tanned leather exported during the calendar year 1925 was \$7,634,326, compared with \$7,383,888 for the 12 months ended March 31, 1925. The several items of export in 1925 were: upper leather, \$4,573,682; sole leather, \$2,517,418; harness, leather, \$451,225; and other unmanufactured leather, \$92,004. The exports to the United States represented 81 p.c. of the total value of leather exported, and the exports to the United Kingdom, 15 p.c. The value of unmanufactured leather imported into Canada in the calendar year 1925 was \$5,884,972, compared with \$3,954,482 in the fiscal year ended March 31, 1925. The imports were chiefly from the United States.


