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


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THE LEATHER FOOTWEAR INDUSTRY

1956

Shipments of leather footwear in 1956 increased in both value and volume. The value of shipments reached a record high point of \$136,681,737, an increase of 9.0 p.c. over the 1955 figure of \$125,552,623 and of 4.1 p.c. over the previous record of \$131,307,119 shown for 1953. The number of pairs shipped was 41,672,181, an increase of 9.7 p.c. over the 37,988,532 pairs shipped in 1955 but 2.9 p.c. below the 42,926,080 pairs shipped in 1946. The average price of all shoes and slippers was \$3.27 per pair as compared with \$3.30 in 1955.

There were 259 plants in operation, two more than in 1955. The industry is centered in Quebec and Ontario, the former province accounting for 58 p.c. of the total value of shipments and the latter for 37 p.c.

Employment was afforded to 20,181 persons, an increase of 2 p.c. over the 19,829 employed in 1955. Salary and wage payments increased by 8 p.c., being \$46,394,642 as compared with \$42,839,930 in the previous year. The cost of materials was \$66,901,254, or 12 p.c. over the 1955 figure of \$59,510,235, and that of fuel and electricity rose by 9 p.c. to \$745,254 from \$682,234. The value added by manufacture rose to \$69,992,895 from \$66,128,612, or by 6 p.c.

Table 1 shows the principal statistics of the industry, by provinces, for 1955 and 1956 and Table 2 shows the Canada totals for each year from 1917 to 1956.

1. Figures for "Value added by Manufacture" are obtained by subtracting cost of materials and cost of fuel and electricity from value of production. In 1952 and 1953 when value of production could not be ascertained, value of shipments was used instead. In 1954 and 1955 value of production was computed from value of shipments by adding or subtracting the change in finished goods inventory, and then deducting cost of materials, fuel and electricity. In 1956 the change in goods in process inventory was also taken into account.

It is customary to present a table of principal statistics for "representative years" in each issue of this report. These "representative years", however, are those that are significant throughout the whole manufacturing field and, therefore, do not

always indicate the variations in individual industries. Table 2 gives the complete record since statistics were first collected for the Leather Footwear Industry in 1917.

In 1954 and 1955 value of production was computed by using the value of shipments plus or minus the increase or decrease in finished goods inventory. For 1956, the change in goods in process inventory was also taken into account.

LEATHER BOOT AND SHOE FINDINGS INDUSTRY

1956

Firms reporting under this industry cover those specializing in the manufacture of parts that are subsequently used in the manufacture or repair of boots and shoes, their main products including items such as box toes, counters, heels, shanks and soles. There were 33 establishments reporting in 1956; 24 of these being in Quebec and 9 in Ontario. The value of shipments in 1956 was \$6,267,090 or 12.7 p.c. above that for 1955.

Cost of materials increased by 11.1 p.c., fuel and electricity by 3.6 p.c. and salary and wage payments by 19 p.c. as compared with 1955. Value added by manufacture increased by 19 p.c. to \$2,608,299.

Of the total value of shipments in 1956, Quebec contributed \$4,314,238 or 68.8 p.c. and Ontario \$1,952,852 or 31.2 p.c.
