



The present volume contains reports of the following industries: miscellaneous leather goods; leather belting; leather boot and shoe findings.

MISCELLANEOUS LEATHER GOODS

The miscellaneous leather goods industry is a combination of the three industries which previous to 1933 were classified as "harness and saddlery", "trunks and bags", and "leather goods, n.e.s.". Included in the industry are all establishments whose chief items of production consist of leather goods of kinds other than those of the separately classified industries of "boots and shoes", "gloves and mittens", "leather belting", and "leather boot and shoe findings". The principal items of production of the miscellaneous leather goods industry are harness and saddlery, trunks, suit cases and club bags, hand bags, leather coats and wind-breakers, and fancy articles of leather.

Production. - The volume of output and the value have steadily advanced during the past two years. The value of all products amounted in 1933 to \$4,460,815, in 1934 to \$5,664,737, and in 1935 to \$6,444,626, an increase in the period of \$1,983,811, or 44 per cent. Increases over 1934 are noted for practically all items excepting those of harness and saddlery. The principal item, "hand bags" shows an increase of 26 per cent in quantity of output and of 34 per cent in value, and the item next in importance, "suit cases and club bags", an increase of 16 per cent in quantity and of 16 per cent in value. The various items of harness and saddlery and items pertaining thereto, such as halters, whips, horse blankets and sweat pads, combined, had a total value of \$1,422,025, compared with a total of \$1,431,578 in 1934, the reduction being due to decreases in the values of double harness, halters, whips and sweat pads which counterbalance increases in other items.

Ontario is the province of first importance in the industry, its value of production in 1935 representing 61 per cent of the total output. Quebec is second with 29 per cent of the total, while the value of output of the other provinces combined, represents the remaining 10 per cent. The number of establishments located in Ontario was 114, in Quebec 54, and in all other provinces, 50, making a total of 218 for the Dominion, compared with 224 in the preceding year.

In Table I, which follows, will be found the quantity and value of the different items of production in the years 1934 and 1935, while the principal statistics of the industry, in the years 1924 to 1935 are given in Table II.

Capital.—The capital investment of the industry in 1935 had a total value of \$5,728,593, compared with \$5,396,028 in the preceding year. For 1935 the total is apportioned as follows: land, buildings and machinery, \$2,703,188; materials and products on hand, stocks in process, etc., \$1,819,018; and cash and accounts and bills receivable, \$1,206,387. The average capital investment per establishment was \$26,278, compared with \$24,089, in 1934.

Employees and Salaries and Wages.—Employment in 1935 was higher than in any year since 1928, while the amount paid in salaries and wages was greater than for any year since 1930. The employees in 1935 numbered 2,422, comprising 545 persons classified as salaried employees and 1,877 as wage-earners. In the former classification are included managers, superintendents, professional and clerical employees and working proprietors, and in the latter, the manual workers, delivery men, etc. The total amount paid to all employees for the year was \$1,955,213, of which the salaried employees received \$613,415, or 31 per cent, and the wage-earners, \$1,341,798, or 69 per cent. Employment for wage-earners reached its peak in November, when the number recorded was 2,149. The low months of the year were January, with 1,530 wage-earners on the pay-roll, and July with 1,572.

Materials Used.—The total cost value of materials used in manufacture during the year was \$3,554,285, comprising leather \$1,663,262, and miscellaneous materials and supplies, \$1,891,023. Under leather, the principal items are cowhide, harness leather, sheepskin and calfskin. The total for all materials and supplies used shows an increase over 1934 of \$801,245, or 29 per cent, and an increase over 1933 of \$1,318,956 or 59 per cent.

THE LEATHER BELTING INDUSTRY, CANADA

There were 13 leather belting factories in operation in Canada in 1935, located by provinces as follows: Quebec, 6; Ontario, 7. The value of production was \$687,314, an increase over 1934 of \$3,817, and an increase over 1933 of \$236,463. The leather belting manufactured had a value of \$559,936, or 81 per cent of the total value of output of the industry. Other items of manufacture include Goodyear welting, leather washers and straps.

BOOT AND SHOE FINDINGS, LEATHER, CANADA, 1935.

This industry includes all plants engaged in the manufacture of any of the following items: leather heels, soles, counters and board. There were 18 of these plants in operation in 1935, Quebec accounting for 12 and Ontario for 6. The value of production of the industry amounted to \$1,322,033, an increase over the preceding year of \$152,579, or 13 per cent, and an increase over 1933 of \$255,423, or 24 per cent. The following table summarizes the principal statistics of the industry, while table 2 gives the value of the leather and other materials used in manufacture, and table 3 the values of the various items of production.
