IRON AND STEEL AND THEIR PRODUCTS

FINAL SUMMARY STATISTICS, 1939

According to final data compiled from the Census of Industry reports for 1939, the production value of iron and steel and their manufactures amounted to \$553,-468,880 at factory prices. This value was 0.9 per cent over the final total for 1938 which in turn was 12.2 per cent under the corresponding total for 1937.

The values by industries for 1939 were as follows, in millions of dollars: pig iron, ferro-alloys, steel and rolled products, 75.9; iron castings, 32.3; heating and cooking apparatus, 15.3; boilers, tanks and platework, 8.8; farm implements, 16.0; machinery, 48.4; automobiles, 107.5; automobile parts, 38.7; bicycles, 2.0; aircraft, 12.6; shipbuilding, 11.2; railway rolling stock and repairs, 60.7; wire and wire goods, 25.0; sheet metal products, 51.5; hardware, cutlery and tools, 23.0; bridge and structural steel work, 15.8; and miscellaneous iron and steel products, 8.3.

The distribution of this production by provinces was as follows: Ontario had \$374.0 millions, Quebec \$100.9, Nova Scotia \$23.8, Manitoba \$19.9, British Columbia \$17.7, New Brunswick \$6.5, Saskatchewan,\$5.3, Alberta \$5.1 and Prince Edward Island \$0.3 millions.

In 1939 a total of 1,394 factories operated in this group. They had a capital investment in Canada of \$697.9 millions and employed a monthly average of 121,041 people who were paid \$158.6 millions as salaries or wages. Materials used in manufacturing processes cost \$262.3 millions and fuel and electricity cost \$15.4 millions.

Canada's imports of iron and steel products advanced to \$183,159,650 in 1939 from \$162,554,216 in 1938 and exports for the same periods rose to \$63,102,432 from \$60,139,369. Re-exports of foreign produce dropped to \$2,034,999 from \$2,188,077.
