

IRON AND STEEL AND THEIF PRODUCTS
FINAL SUMMARY STATISTICS, 1940.

According to final date compiled from the Census of Industry reports for 1940 the production value of iron end steel and their manufactures amounted tc $\$ 906,103,055$ at factory prices. This value was 65 per cent over the final total for 1939.

The values ky industries for 1940 were as follows, in millions of dollars: pig iron, ferro-alloys, steel and rolled products, 114.6 ; iron castings, 49.2 ; heating end cooking epparatus, 20.4; boilers, tanks and platework, 14.9; farm implements, 22.5; machinery, 84.2 ; automobiles, 189.8 ; automobile parts, 64.9 ; bicycles, 2.7 ; aircraft, 26.6; shipbuilding, 44.7 ; railway rolling stock and parts, 95.3 ; wire and wire goods, 32.4; sheet metal products, 64.2; hardware, cutlery ind tools, 35.2 ; bridge and structural steel work, 31.2; and miscellaneous iron and steel products, 13.0.

The distribution of this production by provinces was as follows: Ontario had $\$ 623.2$ millions, \&uebec $\$ 169.7$, Nova Scotia $\$ 35.7$, Menitcba $\$ 24.5$, British Columbia \$29.7, New Brunswick \$9.9, Saskatchewan \$7.3, Alberta $\$ 5.8$, and Prince Edward Island \#0.3 millions.

In 1940 a total of 1,433 factories operated in this group. These works, representing a capital investment in Canada of $\$ 837.4$ millions, employed a monthly everage of ${ }^{*} 164,325$ people vito were paid $\$ 242.7$ millions for salaries or wages. Materials used in manufacturing processes cost $\$ 454.5$ millions and fuel and alectricity cost $\$ 22.2$ millions.

Canada's imports of iron and steel products advanced to $\$ 298,902,743$ in 1940 from $\$ 183,159,650$ in 1939 end exports for the some periods rose $\$ 127,666,846$ from $\$ 63,102,432$. Reexports of foreign produce advanced to $\$ 2,066,230$ from $\$ 2,034,999$.
