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IRON AND STEEL AND THEIR PRODUCTS

FINAL SUMMARY STATISTICS, 1943

According to final data compiled from the Census of Industry reports for 1943, the production value of iron and steel and their manufactures amounted to \$2,575,976,547 at factory prices. This value was 22 per cent over the final total for 1942.

The values by industries for 1943 were as follows, in millions of dollars: pig iron, ferro-alloys, steel and rolled products, \$223.9; iron castings, \$75.5; heating and cooking apparatus, \$27.6; boilers, tanks and platework, \$37.4; farm implements, \$56.9; machinery, \$152.4; automobiles, \$352.2; automobile parts, \$175.1; bicycles, \$3.4; aircraft, \$246.0; shipbuilding, \$376.6; railway rolling stock and parts, \$159.2; wire and wire goods, \$41.1; sheet metal products, \$96.9; hardware, cutlery and tools, \$91.3; bridge and structural steel work, \$72.5; machine shop, \$23.2; and miscellaneous iron and steel products, \$364.7.

The distribution of this production by provinces was as follows: Ontario had \$1,480.5 millions; Quebec, \$674.0; Nova Scotia, \$80.0; Manitoba, \$41.9; British Columbia, \$254.6; New Brunswick, \$18.9; Saskatchewan, \$10.1; Alberta, \$14.9; and Prince Edward Island, \$0.9 millions.

In 1943 a total of 2,044 factories operated in this group. These works, representing a capital investment in Canada of \$1,852.5 millions, employed a monthly average of 435,744 people who were paid \$833.4 millions for salaries and wages. Materials used in manufacturing processes cost \$1,131.9 millions and fuel and electricity cost \$47.3 millions.

Imports of iron and its products totalled \$420.2 millions in 1943 compared with \$377.8 millions in 1942, and exports amounted to \$723.8 millions against \$472.8 millions in 1942. The United States supplied 98 per cent of the 1943 imports and took 7 per cent of the exports, while the United Kingdom provided 2 per cent of the imports and took 33 per cent of the exports.
