IRON AND STEEL AND THEIR PRODUCTS

FINAL SUMMARY STATISTICS, 1944

A final analysis of the 1944 reports from the manufacturers of iron and steel and their products in Canada indicates a gross production valued at \$2,540,992,974 at factory prices. This output value was only 1.3 per cent below the corresponding figure for 1943.

The values by industries for 1944 were as follows, in millions of dollars: pig iron, ferroalloys, steel and rolled products, \$212.5; iron castings \$73.3; heating and cooking apparatus \$27.2; boilers, tanks and platework \$32.3; farm implements \$61.1; machinery \$147.5; automobiles \$324.1; automobile parts \$160.2; bicycles \$3.0; aircraft \$427.0; shipbuilding \$329.3; railway rolling stock and parts \$167.3; wire and wire goods \$41.6; sheet metal products \$109.9; hardware, cutlery and tools \$78.9; bridge and structural steel work \$58.4; machine shops \$29.9; and miscellaneous iron and steel products \$256.4.

The distribution of this production by provinces was as follows: Ontario had \$1,489.2 millions; Quebec \$648.5; Nova Scotia \$87.1; Manitoba \$50.8; British Columbia \$218.2; New Brunswick \$19.1; Saskatchewan \$11.0; Alberta \$16.0; and Prince Edward Island \$1.2 millions.

In 1944 a total of 2,192 factories operated in this group. These works employed a monthly average of 411,944 people who were paid \$818.5 millions for salaries and wages. Materials used in manufacturing processes cost \$1,104.1 millions, and fuel and electricity cost \$46.2 millions.
