PRRJIMINARY SUMMARY REPORT ON THE MANUFACTURES OF THE NON FERROUS METALS IN CANADA, 1931.

Manufactures of the non ferrous metals in Canada during 1931 were valued ai $\$ 222,558,324$, or 112 per cent below the corresponding total for the previous year, according to preliminary figures compiled by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. A total of 449 plants were in operation during the year and a monthly average of 35,566 persons were employed the year round. Payments for salaries and wages totalled $\$ 48,379,423$ and expenditures for manufacturing materials (excluding fuel for power) amounted to $\$ 103,138,43 \%$. Fixed and working capital woes reported at $\$ 321,285,167$.

The manufacturing of non ferrous metals and non ferrous metal products has been divided for statistical purposes into 7 individual groups each of which showed a decline in output value in 1931. production from the electrical apparatus and supplies industry declined $\$ 74,3$ millions to $\$ 90,226,158$, the brass and copper products group dropped $\$ 7.4$ millions to $\$ 17.980,598$, non ferrous smelting and se fining showed a loss of $\$ 2,4$ millions to $\$ 98,565,755$, the jewellery and silverware ind: sty y was off $\$ 1,7$ millions to $\$ 7,572,589$, the white metal alloy group declined a million dollars to $\$ 4,737,600$, aluminium products decreased to $\$ 3,597,764$ from $\$ 4,343.436$, and the output, value of the firms listed in the miscellaneous non ferrous metal products industry dropped to $\$ 477,860$ from $\$ 758,425$.

The majority of the plants in this group were Incated in Ontario and Quebec. Ontario had 307 , or 78 per cent of the factories which accounted for a production of $\$ 131,354,373$ or 59 per cent of the total for "anada. Quebec had 82 esfiabljshments an: an output valued at $\$ 64,973,776$. British Columbia was the ed with 26 plants and a production of $\$ 18,210,705$.

Imports of non ferrous metals and their products into Canada during 1931 were valued at $\$ 38,666,648$ as against $\$ 68,309,300$ in 1930 . of this total $\$ 30,914,645$ or 80 per cont came from the United States and $\$ 1,646,587$ or 12 per cent from the United Kingdom,

Exports y not including re exports, during 1931 were appraised at $\$ 73,841,502$ of which $\$ 43,198,3.55$ went to the United States and $\$ 17,069,285$ to the United Kingdom In 1930 exports totalled $\$ 115,766,626$ in value she exports amounted to $\$ 713,791$ in 1931 and to $\$ 1,426,152$ in 1930.
