THE PRECIOUS METALS PRODUCTS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1927.

Production from the precious metals products industry in Canada in 1927, as reported by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa, was valued at \$11,344,618 and included such articles as jewellery, clocks and watches, silver and silver-plated wares, dental gold and other dental supplies, etc. The comparative output value for 1926 was \$10,751,795 and for 1925 it was \$9,581,773.

Of the 109 firms reporting in this industry 68 were located in Ontario, 27 in Quebec, 5 in British Columbia, 4 in Manitoba, 2 in Alberta and 1 in each of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Saskatchewan. These firms reported a total capital investment of \$11,238,475 and employed a monthly average of 2,806 people. Materials purchased for manufacturing purposes cost \$4,700,560 at the works and the value added by manufacturing was \$6,644,052. In 1927 jewellery, clocks and watches, etc., were the principal products of 81 factories; dental gold and other dental supplies were made by 15 firms; and 13 other firms were engaged chiefly in the manufacture of silverware and silver-plated ware. Output in 1927 included 3.4 million dollars worth of jewellery; 3.6 million dollars worth of silver and silver-plated wares; dental gold valued at \$830,361, clocks and watches at \$800,711; watch cases at \$424,806, and many other articles such as spectacle frames and cases, hookless fasteners, casket hardware, brass hollowware, etc.


