## THE PRECIOUS METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1928.

Production from the Precious Metal Products Industry in Canada during 1928, as reported by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa, was valued at \$11,702,648 and included such articles as jewellery, clocks and watches, silver and silver-plated wares, dental gold and other dental supplies, etc. The comparative output value was \$11,344,618 for 1927 and \$10,751,795 for 1926.

Of the 106 firms reporting in this industry, 64 were located in Ontario, 27 in Quebec, 6 in British Columbia, 5 in Manitoba, and 1 in each of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Saskatchewan and Alberta. These firms reported fixed and working capital of \$11,090,082 and employed an average of 2,932 people during each month of the year. Materials purchased for manufacturing purposes cost \$4,709,743 at the works and the value added by manufacturing was \$6,992,905. In 1928, jewellery, clocks and watches, etc., were the principal products of 79 factories; dental gold and other dental supplies were made by 14 firms; and 13 other firms were engaged chiefly in the manufacture of silverware and silver-plated ware. Output in 1928 included \$3.2 millions worth of silver-plated wares; \$3.6 millions of rings, chains, and other jewellery; clocks and watches at \$894,436; dental gold valued at \$853,530; sterling silver ware, \$661,935; watch cases at \$408,611 and many other articles such as spectacle frames and cases, dental supplies, etc.
